REPORT OF SECRETARY OF STATE.

To His Excellency, Jas. K. Vardaman, Governor of Mississippi:

DEAR SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith the regular biennial report covering the transactions of my department for the fiscal years commencing October 1, 1905, and ending September 30, 1907.

I desire to state in the outset, however, that this report will not be as comprehensive as it has been the custom of the office to make it, and those who have been accustomed to look for certain data therein in the past must be asked to accept the apologies of this department, and at the same time be advised that the usual statistical information heretofore published herein is, by law, required to be published by the Department of Archives and History in the annual of that department. It would, therefore, be a waste of time and a useless expenditure of money to republish in this report what the law requires to be contained in the report of the Department of Archives and History.

With this exception, which we regretfully make, the people of Mississippi will find a great amount of useful reference matter, etc., such, for example, as a complete roster of the county officials in tabulated form, and much other matter of value conveniently arranged for use of the busy man who has not time to search for same.

As your Excellency understands, this department has always occupied a unique position in the State administration, having (until recently) been the only department contributing directly to the industrial growth of the State, because, as custodian of the charter records, I have from year to year, and often from month to month, called attention to the phenomenal increase in various industrial enterprises, manufactures, etc. This, coupled with the fact that scores of letters and inquiries have always poured in upon us asking information as to soil, climate, labor conditions and legal privileges, has made this office a sort of bureau of statistics.

REPORT OF SECRETARY OF STATE

The greater part of this work is now done by the Department of Commerce and Agriculture, but the charter records still remain in my custody, as the highest evidence of the industrial growth of the State.

It will doubtless be gratifying to your Excellency to know that since your administration began, four years ago, the actual increase in the amount of capital invested in corporate enterprises has been fourteen millions of dollars. That is to say, four years ago, when your Excellency was inaugurated, the aggregate of capital stock invested in the two fiscal years preceding your inauguration was \$40,000,000.

During the first two years of your administration the aggregate went up to \$49,150,000. During the past two years of your administration, as shown later on in this report, the aggregate reached \$54,035,500.

This increase is not confined to capital stock alone, but affects the number of enterprises incorporated as well. For example, when you went into office the record for the two preceding years showed 778 corporations chartered; two years later this was increased to 1,008, and during the past two years it was 1,027.

As I have stated the total amount of capital stock authorized and paid for in the two years covered by this report was \$54,035,500, being the greatest amount of capital stock invested in any like period in the history of the department. For convenience and fuller information I have classified the leading industries represented in this aggregate in order to show the net amount of capital stock invested in each, as per the table following:

The capital stock credited to the item "railroads" in this table is not "paper" capital. The item contains only the capital stock in those companies which have organized and which are actually engaged in construction, with the exception of the Pearl River Valley, and that road while not, strictly speaking, engaged in construction work, is nevertheless doing the necessary preparatory work, and must wait some time yet on steel rails.

In the item "Miscellaneous corporations" is included every kind of manufacturing establishment not classified separately. It includes, for example, all woodworking factories, such as factories for making wagons, buggies, etc., and for making staves, headings, pins, boxes, etc. In it is included also one small textile plant and a factory for making chairs, desks, etc.

In connection with the charter business it is interesting to note that it is rapidly becoming a source of considerable revenue to the State, due to the successful operation of the fee law which was passed in 1900. At that time all charters paid the uniform fee of \$3 for recording. The fee law made them pay according to the amount of capital stock employed. Since that law became effective the fees have steadily increased from year to year and now amount to over \$20,000 a year, with a tendency still upward. During the past two years I have collected and paid into the treasury the sum of \$41,383.50, on account of fees. This is more than \$3,000 in excess of the collections for the previous two years, and illustrates the continued increase.

While on the subject of charters granted and new corporations created I again respectfully call attention, as in my last report, to what appears to me to be a very grave oversight of the lawmakers. Our corporation laws are so simple and charters so easily obtainable, while at the same time the benefits accruing to the incorporators and stockholders are so great and the advantages so inviting, that the tendency to incorporate every business, no matter how small, is rapidly growing. Of course there is no objection to the granting of charters and no objection to the number of corporations created, provided, the persons doing business with same are protected from frauds and makeshifts, and provided the corporation does its utmost to protect its creditors.

As the law now stands there is no limitation on the amount of capital paid in, before a corporation can organize. Hence a corporation with an authorized capital of \$25,000, for example, may organize and begin business with any small sum paid in, one, two or more thousands of capital stock. Under these conditions, although the entire amount of capital stock may have been subscribed for, if a majority of the stockholders are insolvent, as is frequently the case, the creditors of the concern have no recourse

on the stockholders, beyond the amount they have subscribed for, and if they have no property out of which this sum can be made, then the creditors lose the entire amount due the concern by the insolvent members. But if there were no pecuniary risk, such a temptation to fraud should not be allowed to stand.

In my judgment this can very simply and equitably be adjusted by two provisions: First, that every corporation organized be required to show, by sworn statement filed with the Secretary of State, that a certain percentage of its entire capital, one-fourth, one-half or what may be found best, be paid in by the stockholders in actual cash. Second, that every dollar of the capital required in the business be subscribed for *bona fide* and that in every case where the amount subscribed for is not fully paid up by the stockholders that he be required to give security for the unpaid balance to the company.

The edition of the Mississippi Code of 1906 was distributed in accordance with section 7, laws 1906, which required fully 3,000 copies. The sale of the Code has amounted to not quite 1,000 copies. I have on hand fully 6,000 copies and would suggest that the price be reduced and the edition sold. One storeroom is filled, a thousand copies in another room and eighteen cases of Codes have never been unpacked for lack of storage. I would suggest that a uniform price of \$2.50 be placed on them in order to dispose of them.

OFFICE HELP.

I have repeatedly called the attention of the Legislature to the urgent need of assistance in this office. The office is now running on the same help given to it twenty years ago. Indeed, there have been many times in the past years when the force was increased by one and often two additional assistants. It should be borne in mind that the work of the office has been gradually but steadily added to from time to time by each succeeding Legislature, until now it is practically double what it should be.

The office is not a burden on the State, in fact it is a large source of revenue to the State. There is no office except that of Insurance Commissioner and Land Commissioner that pays into the treasury of the State more than this department.

When the present charter fee bill was adopted several years ago, during the incumbency of my father, and by his earnest solicitation, the State received only \$3.00 for each charter granted. This law, however, changed the fee system and made the charter business

jump from a small monthly pittance to a handsome source of revenue to the State, and there is paid monthly into the State treasury, in round numbers, about \$2,000 on account of charter fees, etc.

It is, therefore, apparent that the additional help asked for this department can be allowed to it and the taxpayers would never feel it and in the end the office would be able to return to the State treasury in fees collected, many times the additional increase in salary, since it often happens that the present force cannot do extra work which comes to the office.

The charter work has been greatly increased since the passage of the last corporation laws, by requiring the corporations newly created to report to this office immediately, the time, place, date, etc., of its organization, together with names of the board of directors, and the names and addresses of the president and secretary of the corporation.

The work of this department is made up of innumerable details and I find a great deal of my time taken up by attending the various boards of which I am a member and giving my attention to the general condition of the capitol building. In the busy season of the year we are always crowded with work and it is next to impossible to keep up with it. Scarcely a year passes but I am compelled to pay for extra help, and this pay frequently amounts to no inconsiderable sum. But it is absolutely necessary to get off urgent work of various kinds on file, and even then we find it impossible to avoid complaints and criticisms of the people.

I beg to thank your Excellency, in closing this report, for the courtesy you have shown me invariably in the intimate and confidential relations and dealings between my department and your own. And as you leave the official family in the new capitol, I wish to assure you that my very best wishes for a brilliant and prosperous future follow you into your new life.

SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

February 20, 1819.—Two sections donated the State "for a seat of government."

February 12, 1821.—Thomas Hinds, James Patton, Wm. Lattimore, named by act of this date commissioners to locate the two sections.

November 28, 1821.—Thomas Hinds, William Lattimore and James A. Vandorn named as commissioners to locate permanent seat of government, to be called Jackson, in honor of Major-General Andrew Jackson. Present location, then known as "LeFleur's Bluff," selected. Report approved June 30, 1822. The next (sixth) session was "begun and held in the town of Jackson, December 23, 1822."
