CREW Research Findings

Interviewed farmers all had very similar concerns and drivers, which is positive because we can focus on solutions and programming that can benefit everyone.

CREW identified a potential avenue toward expansion:

STEP 1: Assist with Strategic Planning

This will do three things:

- 1) Work with Farmers to identify specific gaps within the production cycle.
- 2) Identify available resources that can bridge those gaps (Steps 2, 3, and 4).
- 3) Work with Farmers to outline a timeline to reach specific milestones.

STEP 2: Identify and Implement Sustainability Methods

The farmer will implement the practices and resources identified that are likely to mitigate the impact of gaps identified during the strategic planning process. Interviewed farmers will? use these methods to do the following:

- 1) Improve natural conditions.
- 2) Reduce the need for human labor.

STEP 3: Identify and Leverage External Resources

External resources include people and organizations that can assist the farmer. Interviewed farmers will? use external resources for the following:

- 1) Support sustainability methods financially or technically
- 2) Increase value-added production
- 3) Expand market

STEP 4: Optimize the use of Social Media

The farmer will increase their social media presence to:

- 1) Expand their market.
- 2) Increase interaction with external resources.
