Received May 11<sup>th</sup> 1858 of George H.  
Mosely seven hundred dollars in full  
for a negro boy named Tom black  
complexion Eleven or twelve years  
of age which said boy we warrant  
to be sound of Body and mind and  
a slave for life and we further war-  
rant and will for ever defend the title  
to the said boy to the said Mosely  
his heirs and assigns for ever again  
-st the claim or claims of all persons  
whatever. Witness our hands and  
Seals The day and year aforesaid
