Sunday Nov 18 1917

My dearest Mother.

This is a beautiful Sunday morning and I have just waked over to our Y.M.C.A. to write some letters. First I went by town and got a real good bath as we can't possibly get but one a week at the school and it is not very convenient nor very good. I received only one letter from you this past week. This Y.M.C.A. building is a beautiful place and they have services here at 5:30 P.M. on Sundays. The rooms are very large and the carvings and ornaments are wonderful. The work here now is very hard and just think when





the course is completed that we will be the first men of our army to go through with it. I believe our government will keep it as a permanent school for the artillery. The weather is fine to-day but during the last few days it has been real cold.

I have had in order for sometime for a whip cord suit but have been unable to get it so far. On my way here I purchased a heavy trench coat and it is certainly coming in fine. It rains here almost every day but rain or shine we go through with the schedule.
