If you're putting in effort, that's a sign you're learning and growing. Make mistakes, learn from them, change strategies, and try again. (2) Practice empathy. The world is full of people with vastly different worldviews, who were raised in different circumstances. Put yourself in others' shoes and try to understand their values and their reasons for believing something before you criticize those beliefs.



Ty R. Warren Debate Union

Debate at the University of Mississippi prioritizes personal skill and knowledge development, institutional ambassadorship, and fostering an inclusive, enjoyable, and close-knit environment. Housed within the Lott institute, the Warren Debate Union practices competitively practices the Parliamentary World's style debate format at a national and even international level with other academic institutions across the ideological and geographical spectrum. This style itself was chosen as it is incredibly complementary to those involved in higher education, particularly public policy, for a number of key structural reasons: firstly, each round is on a different pressing issue or current event meaning that those well versed in policy issues and solutions tend to be successful and while still proving to be an excellent opportunity to learn about issues you are less familiar about in the process, complimenting your in-class academic education. Secondly, as each round is on a different topic and each team is allowed only fifteen minutes of preparation beforehand, debaters develop skills such as quick, critical thinking and composure that possess clear transferability to both academic and professional pursuits while insuring students do not have to spend excessive time outside of tournaments or practice writing or memorizing speeches and arguments. Thirdly, and potentially most importantly, debate can

help students appreciate the complexities and nuances of the pressing issues of our times in a way that transcends partisanship. Because good debaters learn how to argue for and against both sides of topics, they also learn that most controversial issues are controversial because they are multifaceted and complex-- thereby growing in an appreciation and sympathy of most perspectives even when they do not share them-- a truly worthwhile aspiration of any current or future public policy leader. There are no tryouts or dues associated with joining the Warren Debate Union and travel expenses are covered. Qualification for traveling is purely determined by attendance, availability, and contribution to debates and discussions. Debaters are only expected to dedicate the time that they can without interfering with the other important aspects of a holistic college experience.
