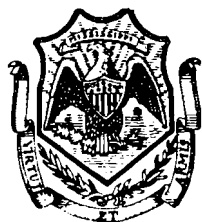

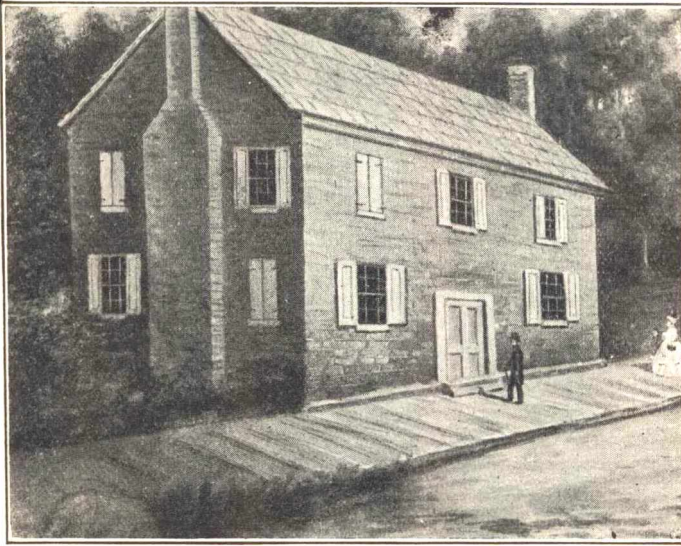

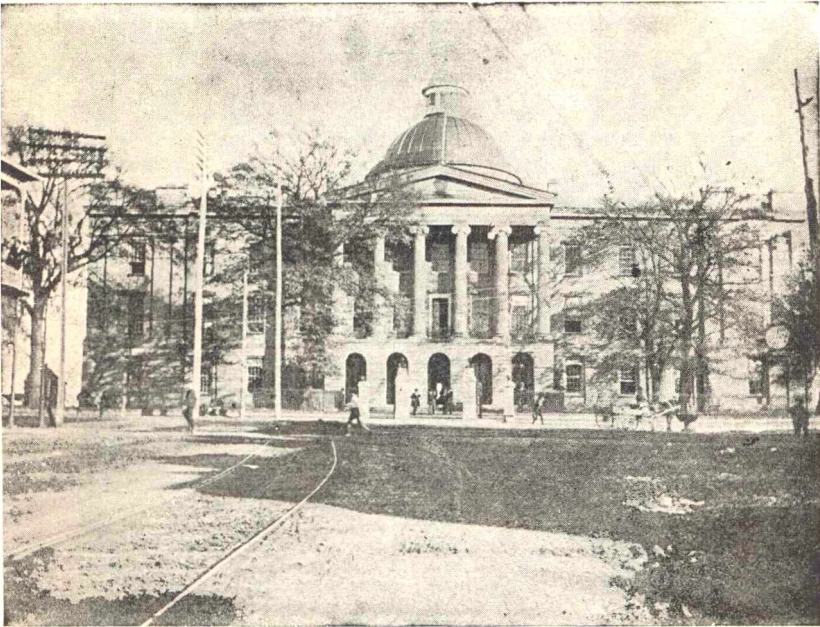

### FIRST CAPITOL BUILDING

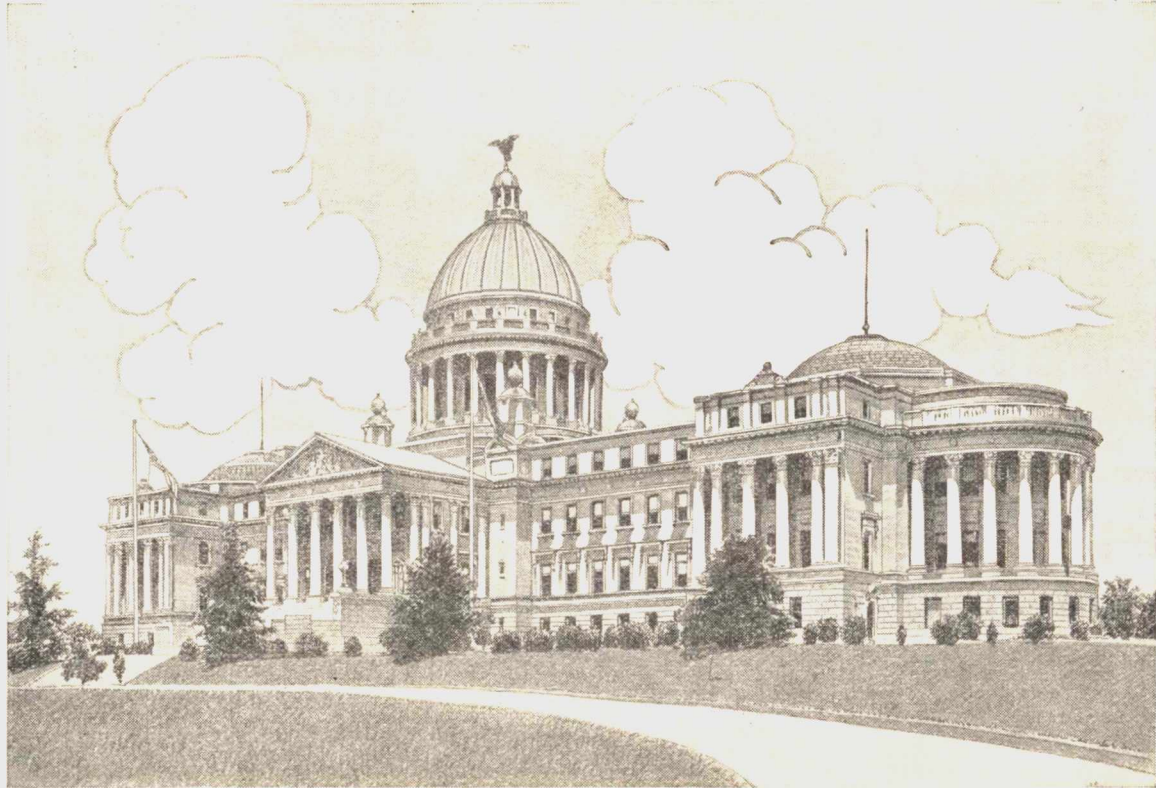
Today but a historic memory, Mississippi's State House, or Capitol, was a small brick building which stood where the Harding Building now stands at the corner of Capitol and President Streets.

It was here that Robert J. Walker, a Mississippian who achieved national fame, was elected to the United States Senate. Andrew Jackson spoke in it when a candidate for President of the United States.



### OLD CAPITOL BUILDING

Aside from its value as a historic landmark, the Old Capitol possesses intrinsic value as a piece of architecture of harmonious outline and admirable proportions. Built in 1840, it was the scene of stormy debate and fateful decisions during the Civil War and re-construction periods. The Legislature of 1916 at the instance of the Women's patriotic organizations of the state appropriated money for the restoration of the exterior and the remodeling of the interior as offices to accommodate departments of the state government.



#### NEW CAPITOL BUILDING

This domicile of Mississippi's government is admittedly one of the handsomest capitol buildings in the entire Union. Built Bedford limestone and containing every type of marble used for interior decoration, this structure, at a period when graft public buildings was epidemic throughout the country, was built within the appropriation of one million dollars, without and without the sale of bonds or the increase of the tax levy.

# Biennial Report Secretary of State

## Office of Secretary of State

Jackson, Miss., Jan. 1, 1930.

Hon. Theodore G. Bilbo, Governor of the State of Mississippi and  
Members of the Mississippi Legislature.

Gentlemen:

I have the honor to submit to you for your consideration, in compliance with law, a report of the business transacted by this department during the past fiscal biennium from October 1, 1927 to October 1, 1929.

Elsewhere you will find a table prepared showing the foreign and domestic capital that has come into the state by months during the years from 1916 to 1926 to October 1, 1929, covering the past three and a half administrations. The marked increase in both State and foreign capital voices a most deserved confidence in the state and expresses in no uncertain terms that Mississippi's possibilities offer inducement for investment of capital equal to any other State. The liberal corporation laws passed by the 1926 and 1928 sessions of the Legislature have been outstanding factors that have put capital to work in Mississippi.

### OFFICE WORK

The office work in the department of the Secretary of State has increased over 65 per cent during the past four years. The work has been handled at very little additional expense by reason of the efficiency of the office force, and by putting in extra hours. Below is the statement of cash receipts for the past four bienniums, and the capitalization of charters of both foreign and domestic for the same period. This is a fair comparison of the increase of the two main items of the department. All other clerical work in connection with the department has increased in proportion:

In addition to the above heavy increase of cash receipts and capitalization during the past four years appropriations were disbursed through the Secretary of State's department during the



biennium of 1926-1927 to the amount of \$195,337.63, biennium 1928-1929 of \$215,268.18, a total for the four year period of \$410,505.81.

(NOTE—Balances in some of the funds lapsed into the treasury, but not enough to materially lessen the amount of the appropriations.)

The income (and expenditures by appropriation) amounts to a business of over \$175,000.00 annually handled by the Secretary of State's department, based on the business done during the past two bienniums. The detail work has increased to such an extent that it is necessary to have a bookkeeper so that the business can be more efficiently dispatched, and I hope the Legislature will provide for a bookkeeper for this department.

### **CORPORATION ACT 1928**

The Legislature of 1928 passed House Bill 655 which provided for the creation of a new sub-division of the Secretary of State's Department. The law went into effect April 13, 1928. In a year and eight months this division has collected \$56,280.00 and the amount has been turned into the State Treasury except \$3,600.00 per year disbursed from the collections for administrative purposes, as the law directs. A full statement of the operation of the department appears on another page.

### **FILING SYSTEM**

In the Secretary of State's department we are using generally, filing cases that were installed 25 years ago, and they are obsolete, and are not adapted to filing many papers that we have to handle at this time. We request the Legislature to make an appropriation of \$500.00 to purchase such modern filing cases as are needed.

### **CAPITOL BUILDINGS**

As keeper of the Capitol Buildings and Grounds, I want to call your attention to their general condition.

The New Capitol Building was first occupied in 1903 and has been in use for 26 years. The time has arrived when the building should be gone over and considerable repair work done. I suggest that the Committee on Buildings and Grounds of the Senate and House make a minute inspection of the two Capitols and Grounds and draw a bill to have all the necessary work done to put them in first class condition.

The work that is necessary to keep the buildings and grounds up and in good condition varies materially, and is of such volume that it is impossible to itemize it, but by keeping up with repair work and having it done promptly, the buildings and grounds, generally speaking, are in creditable condition.

The clocks in the New Capitol have been in use 25 years and are worn out. The Western Union proposes to furnish new clocks and time service for 24 clocks for \$447.00 per year. An additional charge will be made of \$5.00 per clock for taking out the old ones and putting in new ones. We are now paying \$188.00 per year for the time service for our own clocks. Considering repairs, parts, and the cost of the new clocks, the Western Union proposition is the better of the two.

### **ENGINE ROOM**

The machinery in the engine room is in good shape, and with the usual general repair expense, the machinery will run for the next few years without a general overhauling. The boiler settings and furnaces have been rebuilt.

### **OFFICE ROOM**

In both Capitols additional office and storage space is needed. At the Old Capitol, some hallways have been pressed into service and equipped for use as offices. A fireproof storage room, under the direction of a competent filing clerk, would relieve the congestion for the present, and rooms in the New and Old Capitols now being used for storage, could be converted into offices.

### **GROUNDS**

The heavy auto traffic over the drive-ways at both Capitols make it necessary that they be widened and hard-surfaced to give the proper protection to the public. In their present condition the drive-ways are dangerous. The Highway Department has made a survey of the grounds and have furnished me with plans and specifications for improving the driveways. To concrete the drive-ways and take care of the drainage properly at both Capitols, they estimate the cost at approximately \$20,000.00.

Many of the trees on the New Capitol grounds are in bad condition and young trees should be planted now to take the places of the old ones when they have to be removed.

**INDEX**

This department needs a complete general index of the corporations. As it is now, each record book contains the index for the charters in that book, and as we are now using record book number 30, it is necessary to handle from 1 to 30 books in looking up a charter. A modern index system should be installed. I think an appropriation of \$3,000.00 will cover this needed facility. The constant handling of the record books in looking up charters has caused the backs to wear and a number of the books should be re-bound.

**STATE PRINTING**

The 1928 session of the Legislature appropriated for Public Printing \$45,000.00 for the year 1928, and \$35,000 00 for 1929, a total of \$80,000.00 to be disbursed by the State Board of Public Contracts. For each biennium of the past, I am informed, this fund has shown a deficit. It is impossible to tell exactly what the printing will amount to annually.

Appropriations for printing have been made for some State departments in addition to the above appropriations. In my judgment, if all appropriations for printing, and all printing, was brought under the State contracts and paid for by the State Board of Public Contracts, some money could be saved the State.

**SECRETARY OF STATE'S BOND**

The Secretary of State's office will handle on an average between \$8,000.00 and \$10,000.00 per month in fees. Under the law all departments are required to make a settlement twice a month with the State Treasurer. As an average, the Secretary of State would not have in his possession more than \$5,000.00 in his official fund before making settlement with the State Treasurer. However, in view of the fact that the business of the office is growing, it might be the part of wisdom to increase the bond of \$10,000.00 of the Secretary of State to a greater sum.

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**CORPORATION ACT OF 1928**

The 1928 session of the Mississippi legislature enacted a Corporation Law, known as House Bill No. 655, and designated in the statutes as Chapter 90, Laws of 1928. This new corporation act provided for the creation of a sub-division or bureau of the department of Secretary of State, which has come to be known as the "Special Corporation Division."

The law amended and changed in many ways the former existing corporation laws of the state. It provides that every corporation, foreign or domestic, doing business or authorized to do business in Mississippi, must "file with the Secretary of State, on or before June 30th of each year, a written statement showing its name, domicile in this State, principal office within or without this state, character of its business, name and address of its resident agent in this state, if any, its authorized capital stock, its outstanding capital stock, and the names and addresses of its officers and directors, which statement shall be signed by one or more of its officers or by two of its directors."

This law provides further that every foreign corporation doing business in the state must file a written power of attorney, designating the Secretary of State, or in lieu thereof, designate an agent, upon whom service of process may be served, and the failure to comply with either of the above requirements subjects the offending corporation to a penalty.

This Act, H. B. 655, was approved and became a law on April 13, 1928, and provided that it take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

It will be seen that there was little time to elapse after the approval of this Act, until the penalty provided for not reporting should be applied—that is from April 13th to June 30th.

This being a new department, or branch, of the secretary of state's department, the installation and work of which was entirely foreign to the general routine of the office, it necessarily required some time to set this new work in motion. Blanks had to be planned, printed and mailed out to more than 7,500 corporations of record in the department of secretary of state. Circular letters, setting forth the law, information and instructions, also had to be printed to send out with the blanks, and much general routine work had to be done before the corporations were made familiar with the requirements contained in the new law.

As was known at the time, many hundreds of corporations on record in the office of the secretary of state, incorporated over a period embracing more than a quarter century, have long since passed into discard—lapsing from various causes. However, they had not been legally dissolved as the law directs, and were still on the books of record, and all of these had to be supplied with report blanks, letters of instruction, etc. As a natural consequence, many hundreds of these letters and blanks were “returned to sender,” with various and sundry reasons assigned therefor. It was this, however, that brought the new law into popularity—because it made and is making possible a permanent record of live, going and now existing corporations—a record that has proven and will prove valuable to both legal and commercial circles.

The process of elimination, outlined above, has brought to light that approximately half the corporations recorded in the Secretary of State’s department are today live, functioning enterprises—the others either dissolved or “dead” from various reasons. The existing corporations and those to be approved and recorded, have to report annually, thus insuring a valuable list of live corporations for those who may have need of this information. They also bring into the State’s treasury a steady revenue.

In enacting this law, the legislature provided that not exceeding \$3,600.00 per annum should be retained by the Secretary of State out of the funds collected as fees, with which to employ “such assistants as he may need to comply with this Act.” Thus it will be observed that the new division is not an expense to the State, but pays its way and a splendid revenue into the State treasury.

Notwithstanding the short time in which to report from the date of passage of the Act until the penalty was applicable, practically every live corporation in Mississippi responded promptly to the request. Comparatively few failed to come within the time allowed. The law provides that if a corporation does not file its report by June 30th, each year it is subject to a penalty of ten dollars, but does not say who shall apply the penalty. Further on in the act it is provided that the Secretary of State shall send final notice and the corporation has six months within which to file the report, pay the fee and penalty, and if it does not pay the fees and penalty within six months after final notice, it shall be subject to a penalty of not over five hundred dollars, to be collected by the Attorney General. If a delinquent corporation does not pay within the



six months after final notice, then the matter is referred to the Attorney General for settlement. We assume that the Legislature intended that we should collect the ten dollars penalty, and that those that do not pay within six months after final notice should be referred to the Attorney General, and we have, therefore, followed this course.

The year 1929 brought about better and more systematic methods of bringing this division up to the desired standard. More time and thought was available to perfect the filing system, and more attention given to correspondence in connection with its proper conduct. Improved ideas and more convenient methods have been brought into play to make the records readily accessible and easily discernable. We expect to make still further improvements as the work of the division increases.

The collections, on account of fees charged in this law, from July 1, 1928, to December 1, 1929, amount of \$56,280.00, is distributed by months and years, as follows:

BIENNIAL REPORT  
STATE GAME LAWS

Chapter 178, Laws of 1926

AN ACT to amend chapter 181 of the laws of 1922, so as to provide for the protection, preservation and propagation of birds, game and fish: to conserve same for the benefit of agriculture and for the benefit and consumption of the inhabitants of this state; to make it unlawful to kill, catch or injure birds, game or fish except as provided by the terms of this act; to provide for the enforcement of the provisions of this act and to fix penalties for the violation thereof; to provide for the appointment of county game and fish wardens; to prescribe their duties and fix their compensation.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi. That chapter 181 of the laws of 1922, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person at any time to capture wild water fowl in traps, nets or other contrivances or to use reflectors or other lights at night for the purpose of shooting at, killing, or in any manner taking or scaring wild water fowl, fur-bearing animals, quail, or any other game described in this act, except opossums and raccoons.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot wild water fowl with any shot gun of larger bore than number ten (10) or with any rifle or any gun that can not be shot from the shoulder.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any proprietor of any restaurant or hotel to serve his patrons or customers birds, or animals or parts thereof, mentioned under the provisions of this act, other than rabbit, except when they are prepared for eating for the hunter who killed same.

Sec. 3. (a) The federal migratory bird treaty regulations being the supreme law of the land under article VI of the constitution of the United States are hereby declared to be the law of this state. Possessors of federal permits to propagate and sell migratory water fowl or to collect migratory birds for scientific purposes shall be allowed to do so without local permits, however such holders of federal permits must be prepared to show them upon demand of any officer of the law, and must each January file one copy of their annual report to the U. S. secretary of agriculture, with the Mississippi secretary of state at Jackson, Mississippi.

(b) The taking of any migratory bird unlawfully, or the needless disturbance or destruction of a migratory bird's nest or eggs, shall be considered a separate offense, except as provided in section 3 herein.

(c) The open season on certain migratory game birds as provided in the federal migratory bird treaty regulations is as follows: In Mississippi: Sora and other rails (except coot and gallinules) September 1st, to November 30, woodcock from November 1st to December 31st, mourning doves from September 16th to December 31st, all other migratory game water fowl from November 1st to January 31st.



(d) A person may take in any one day during the open season prescribed herein not to exceed the following number of migratory game birds: ducks (except wood duck and eider duck) twenty-five in the aggregate of all kinds.

Sora—forty. Black bellied and golden plovers and greater and lesser yellow legs—fifteen in the aggregate of all kinds. Brant or wild geese—eight. Rails, coot and gallinules (except sora) twenty-five in the aggregate of all kinds. Wilson snipe, or jack snipe—twenty-five. Woodcock—six. Doves (mourning) twenty-five.

The taking at any time of any other migratory game birds, such as wood ducks (summer ducks), swans, little brown, sandhill and whooping cranes, curlews, sandpipers, stilts, and willett is unlawful under the federal migratory bird treaty regulations—except as provided for breeding or scientific purposes.

(e) The open season for certain non-migratory game birds shall be in Mississippi for bob-whites (partridges, quails) from November 20th to January 15th; for wild turkey, from January 1st to March 31st. A person may take in any one day during the open season prescribed therefor herein, not to exceed the following numbers of non-migratory game birds; bob-whites (partridges, quails), fifteen. Wild turkeys—gobblers in one season, two, (turkey hens not to be taken in open or closed season.) It shall be unlawful to take at any time in Mississippi any or all other non-migratory game birds, such as ruffed grouse, pheasants, and western quail, provided, however, that the plumage of pheasants may be had in possession when brought in from outside of the state.

Sec. 4. It shall be unlawful to shoot or intentionally kill or harm at any time any bird that is not harmful to man or his property or that is not classed as a game bird herein and provision made for the taking of same.

The following birds shall be classed as harmful: Blackbirds, buzzards, crows, blue-jay, English (house) sparrows, sharp shinned hawks (small blue darters), Cooper's hawk, (large or blackcapped blue), goshawks, duck hawks, pigeon hawks, great horned owls.

Sec. 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to set fire to the woods or sage fields, other than his own or leased premises, during the nesting season of game birds, beginning March 15th, in each year, and provided further, that the boards of supervisors may prohibit such burning at any time.

Sec. 6. It shall be unlawful for any non-resident to kill more than twenty-five (25) migratory game birds in any one day, or to sell migratory or game birds killed by him whether within or without the state.

Sec. 7. (a) The following wild animals shall be classed as game: Bear, beaver, deer, fox, opossums, raccoons, rabbits and squirrels.

(b) The following game and other animals shall be classed as fur-bearing animals: Beaver, fox, muskrats, opossum, otters, raccoons, rabbits, skunks, weasels and minks, but fur-bearing pelts may be shipped to market during open season and for five days thereafter.

(c) The open season and bag limit on game shall be as follows:

Bear, from November 1st to February 28th. Season bag limit—one.

Beaver, no open season shall be allowed on beaver until after January 1st, 1930, nor shall their dams and houses be needlessly destroyed. Deer, from November 15th to February 15th, day's bag limit—one; season's bag limit—three; provided, that no doe or spotted fawn be killed at any time and that deer shall not be hunted at night.

Hares and rabbits may be hunted at any time, except as prohibited by section 2 (a). Opossum may be hunted from October 1st to January 15th. Squirrels may be hunted from May 1st to June 1st, and from October 1st to December 15th; day's bag limit, 15. Wild cats may be hunted at any time.

There shall be no open season on fox. It shall be unlawful to scare, drive, force or dig one out of the ground, or to scare, knock or shoot one out of a tree, or to fell a tree on which there is a fox, provided, however, it shall be lawful to chase a fox with hounds, or allow hounds to kill them on the ground in chase, from August 1st to March 1st.

The open season on raccoons shall be from November 15th to February 1st.

(d) The open season for fur-bearing animals, except as provided for in section 4 (c) shall be from December 1st to February 1st.

However, the proprietor of a musk rat preserve, where musk rats are propagated by such proprietor for commercial purposes, and for which is paid a privilege tax to operate, may trap such musk rats on such a preserve, during the months of December, January and February.

(e) Game, fur-bearing animals, or birds run out of their natural habitat by high water or fire shall not be hunted until conditions permit their return to their regular haunts.

(f) The following may be killed when doing harm, by owners or tenants, upon their holdings or by officers of the law, at any time: Minks, skunks, opossum and weasels.

Sec 8. Fur-bearing animals may be trapped only between December 1st and February 1st of each year. Every trapping device shall be inspected every thirty-six hours by the person setting same, and the contents of such device, if any, shall be removed.

Sec. 9. (a) For the purpose of this act, the following shall be considered as game fish:

Family contrachidae, including crappie (chinaquapin perch, goggle eye, speckled perch) calico bass (red eyed, goggle eyed), breasted bream, long eared sunfish, blue gill (copper nosed sunfish), black bass, (small mouthed black bass), straw bass, (large mouthed black bass, green bass, bayou bass, chub, trout, green trout). Family percidae, including Jack perch, wall eyed pike and yellow perch (ringed perch). Family serranidae, including white bass and yellow bass.

(b) It shall be unlawful to take or kill game fish in any way except by hook and line or dip nets, except in private ponds or in barrow pits, or overflow ponds which go dry in the summer, when same is cut off from the regular stream, and it shall be unlawful to kill or take fish at any time or anywhere by the use of lime or poison.

(c) It shall be unlawful, except as provided in section 7 (b), to take more than twenty-five (25) of any one kind of game fish in any one day and it shall be unlawful to take a total of more than one hundred (100) game fish in any one day. Any crappie, calico bass, black bass, straw bass, pike, perch, yellow perch, white bass and yellow bass taken shorter than six (6) inches, and all other game fish shorter than four (4) inches, shall be returned at once to the water, unless they were taken from private ponds, overflow ponds, or barrow pits, as provided in section 9 (b).

Sec. 10 (a) It shall be unlawful to place any trap, set net, or haul seine so to wholly obstruct the passage of fish in any river, bayou, creek or other body of running water in this state, or to occupy with such apparatus more than one-half of the width of such waters.

(b) The board of supervisors may regulate the taking of non-game or gross fish and prescribe the size and kind of nets, traps, and seines to be used, and the manner and method of such taking. Provided, however, no set or haul nets or seines of less than two inch mesh shall be used.

Sec. 11. If any fish, prohibited to be caught, shall be accidentally caught or taken in any effort to catch other fish, or otherwise, the same shall be immediately returned to the water alive.

Sec. 12 The owner of any game preserve, duly authorized and licensed to operate said preserve, shall be permitted to ship into, out of, or within the state any game birds or game or fur-bearing animals grown on his own or leased property, when such game birds or game or fur-bearing animals are to be used for propagation purposes only.

Sec. 13 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell or buy any game, fish or game birds described in this act, dead or alive, other than rabbits, sea or gross fish, except birds and animals as provided in section 12.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to ship, transport, carry or send out of the state at any time the carcass or parts thereof of any game or fur-bearing animal, and it shall be unlawful for any common carrier, its agent, or employees to receive same for shipment or transportation to any point out of the state.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any common carrier, its agent or employees to receive for shipment or transportation, fresh or green hides or hides of any game or fur-bearing animal, except during the open season on such animals, and for five days following.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any common carrier or railroad company to receive for transportation, or to transport any birds, fish or game, or fur-bearing animals, other than as permitted in section 12, and in sub-sections (e) and (f) hereof, except when they are in possession of the hunter

or hunters who killed same or under such hunter or hunters personal supervision while in transit, provided, however, no carcass or parts of carcass of game or fur-bearing animals are to be carried or transported out of the state.

(e) A non-resident fisherman may take out of the state for his own personal use, when caught by him, not more than twenty-five (25) game fish of any or all kinds.

(f) A non-resident hunter may take out of the state for his own personal use, when killed by him, not to exceed one day's bag limit of any or all game birds as listed in section 3 (d) and (e) hereof.

(g) Nothing in this act shall prevent the transportation and free movement of circus, show or vaudeville act or exhibition using trained or other animals or fowls.

Sec. 14. All trappers and hunters shall carry a license for which they shall pay as follows: Non-residents,—trappers, \$500.00 for each county in which they trap.

Resident trappers and hunters, for furs shall pay a license of \$10.00 in each county in which they trap or hunt for furs.

Non-resident hunters, county license \$10.00, state license \$15.00.

Non-resident fishermen, \$2.00 for each county in which they fish.

Resident hunters, county license, not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$3.00 in the discretion of the board of supervisors, state license, \$3.00.

State licenses shall be valid in any county, the fee for same to remain in the county where issued. Provided, however, that no resident of this state shall be required to purchase license to hunt, trap or fish, on lands owned or leased by such resident, but this shall not exempt him from any of the other provisions of this act.

Minors under sixteen years of age shall not be required to purchase hunting or fishing licenses, nor shall any person be required to purchase a license for hunting rabbits.

That the word "non-resident" in this act shall be interpreted to mean any person who is not a bona fide resident of Mississippi, and in no case shall it be construed to apply to any bona fide resident of Mississippi.

Sec. 15. All licenses provided for herein shall be issued by the sheriff of the county on blanks to be furnished him by the board of supervisors and paid for out of the bird, game and fish fund hereinafter provided for, said license to be good from July 1st of the year issued, until June 30th of the following year. And it shall be the duty of the sheriff to furnish with each license issued, a copy of this act and of the federal laws relating to the protection of game, fish, and fur-bearing animals.

Sec. 16. (a) It shall be the duty of the board of supervisors of each county, not later than a second regular meeting after this act goes into effect, to appoint a bird, game and fish warden who shall hold office for

a term of two years, unless sooner removed by the board, and who shall execute a bond with good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the chancery clerk in the penal sum of \$1,000.00 conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties.

(b) The said game, bird and fish warden shall appoint as many deputy bird, game and fish wardens as he may deem necessary to perform the duties hereinafter prescribed, at such compensation as may be fixed by the board, same to be paid out of the bird, game and fish fund, and the said deputies or deputy may be removed by the warden at any time.

(c) It shall be the duty of the said bird, game and fish warden as well as the sheriffs, deputies, constables and police officers, to seek and arrest all persons violating any of the provisions of this act, and to do and perform all other things and acts that may be necessary for the strict enforcement of all the provisions of this act.

(d) The bird, game and fish warden shall have and receive \$50.00 per month or such other compensation as the board of supervisors may determine, and one half of all fines levied and collected under the provisions of this act. Provided, however, the fund hereinafter provided for is sufficient to pay such salary and the compensation of his deputies.

Sec. 17. All license fees and fines shall go into a fund and be kept as other county funds are kept, and shall be known as "the bird, game and fish, fund," and same shall be used by the board of supervisors in paying any warden, deputies or other person employed to carry out the provisions of this act, and any other expenses connected with the operation of this act.

Sec. 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, shoot, fish or trap or otherwise trespass on the lands of another in any county of the state, after having been warned not to do so, either in person or by written "posted" notices put up on such land in conspicuous places, unless with written permission from the land owner, tenant, agent or other person having the legal right to grant the same.

Sec. 19. The board of supervisors may adopt and from time to time modify or repeal such regulations as they may deem necessary or proper for the further protection and preservation of birds, game and fish in their respective counties, and the circumstances under which birds, game and fish may be taken and by whom and in what quantity and to what extent, and may entirely prohibit the taking of any certain species of birds, game or fish for one or more years. Provided, however, that the board of supervisors cannot and shall not adopt any order or resolution contrary to the provisions of this act, or favoring residents of any one county as against the residents of any other counties within this state.

Sec. 20. (a) The circuit judges shall give the grand juries, when empaneled, the provisions of the bird, game and fish laws strictly in charge and shall urge strict inquiry into infractions thereof.

(b) It shall be the duty of the sheriff and his deputies, or any constable of any county, to appear before the grand jury of any such county and give any information as to any violations of this act, or to report any offender against any of the provisions of this act to a justice of the peace in said county, to be dealt with according to law.

Sec. 21. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished, upon conviction thereof, by a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Sec. 22. This act shall in no way abridge, affect or repeal any of the statutes, laws or acts relative to or relating to the duties or powers of the board of oyster commission.

Sec. 23. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with any of the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 24. In the event that any section or part of section of this act shall be declared unconstitutional, it is hereby specifically provided that such declaration shall not invalidate other parts of this act and the remainder not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

Sec. 25. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

#### MISSISSIPPI STATE GAME AND FISH LAWS

As Amended by Regular and Extra Sessions of 1928 and Extra Session 1929

#### SENATE BILL No. 299

AN ACT to amend section 12 of chapter 178 of the laws of Mississippi of 1926 pertaining to the shipping of game birds or game and fur-bearing animals from the state.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That Section 12 of Chapter 178 of the Mississippi Laws of 1926, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 12. The owner of any game preserve, duly authorized and licensed to operate said preserve, shall be permitted to ship into, out of, or within the state any game birds or game or fur-bearing animals grown on his own or leased property, when such game birds or game or fur-bearing animals are to be used for propagation purposes only; provided, however, that no game birds or game or fur-bearing animals shall be shipped out of the state except during the open season for hunting or trapping said birds or animals."

Sec. 2. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, February 20, 1928.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1034

AN ACT to amend section fourteen of chapter 178 of the laws of 1926 so as to provide that adults over seventy years of age shall not be required to purchase hunting or fishing license.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That Section 14, of Chapter 178 of the laws of 1926 be and the same are hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 14. All trappers and hunters shall carry a license for which they shall pay as follows: Non-residents,—trappers, \$500.00 for each county in which they trap.

Resident trappers and hunters for furs shall pay a license of \$10.00 in each county in which they trap or hunt for furs.

Non-resident fishermen, \$2.00 for each county in which they fish.

Resident hunters, county license, not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$3.00, in the discretion of the board of supervisors, state license, \$3.00.

State licenses shall be valid in any county, the fees for same to remain in the county where issued. Provided, however, that no resident of this state shall be required to purchase license to hunt, trap or fish, on lands owned or leased by such resident, but this shall not exempt him from any of the other provisions of this act.

Minors under sixteen years of age and adults over seventy years of age, shall not be required to purchase hunting or fishing licenses, nor shall any person be required to purchase a license for hunting rabbits.

That the word "non-resident" in this act shall be interpreted to mean any person who is not a bona fide resident of Mississippi, and in no case shall it be construed to apply to any bona fide resident of Mississippi.

Sec. 2. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved April 26, 1928.

## HOUSE BILL No. 747

AN ACT designating persons entitled to receive licenses to trap for fur-bearing animals, and providing the conditions upon which said licenses may be issued.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That no person shall be permitted to trap for fur-bearing animals in this state, or receive a license therefor, except such persons as shall have resided continuously in this state for one year next preceding the opening of the trapping season for such animals.

Sec. 2. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved April 13, 1928.

BIENNIAL REPORT  
HOUSE BILL No. 556

AN ACT to provide for the conservation and protection and to regulate the taking of salt water fish in the waters of the Mississippi sound and waters adjacent thereto lying within the state of Mississippi and to provide penalties for the violation thereof.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That the months of March and April of each year shall be a closed season for the taking of speckled sea trout in the waters of the Mississippi sound, and waters adjacent thereto, lying within the state of Mississippi.

Sec. 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to have in possession, sell or ship speckled sea trout during the months of March and April of each year, but this provision shall not apply to those operating licensed vessels engaged in fishing for speckled sea trout outside the waters of the state of Mississippi, provided, however, that the same shall not be possessed, sold, shipped, offered or received for shipment until the master of the vessel bringing such fish into port shall have made an affidavit that the same were caught in waters outside the state of Mississippi, which affidavit shall be kept by the dealer or shipper for public inspection.

Sec. 3. That it shall be unlawful to have in possession, to catch, to offer for sale or to ship at any time speckled sea trout under ten inches in length.

Sec. 4. That it shall be unlawful for any person to catch more than twenty-five speckled sea trout in any one day, but this shall not apply to licensed vessels engaged in commercial fishing.

Sec. 5. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use any power trawl boat, or boats, in the catching or taking of shrimp within two miles of the main shore line of the waters of the Mississippi sound, but this section shall not prohibit the catching and taking of shrimp by such means at or near Point au Chiene, and Gulfport channel.

Sec. 6. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation engaged in the catching and taking of shrimp in the waters of the Mississippi sound by means of power trawl boats, to use trawl nets with mesh less than two inches or one inch bar.

Sec. 7. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for the first offense, and for any subsequent offense not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than two hundred dollars.

Sec. 8. That this act take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage.

Approved March 8, 1926.



## CHAPTER 81

## SENATE BILL No. 127

AN ACT to amend section 3 of chapter 178 of the law of 1926, to change the open season for mourning doves and bob white (partridges, quails).

**Federal Migratory Bird Law, restriction of.**

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That section 3 of chapter 178 of the law of 1926 be, and the same is amended so as to read as follows:

(a) The federal migratory bird treaty regulations being the supreme law of the land under Article VI of the constitution of the United States are hereby declared to be the law of this state. Possessors of federal permits to propagate and sell migratory water fowl or to collect migratory birds for scientific purposes shall be allowed to do so without local permits, however such holders of federal permits must be prepared to show them upon demand of any officer of the law, and must each January file one copy of their annual report to the U. S. Secretary of Agriculture, with the Mississippi Secretary of State at Jackson, Mississippi.

**Migratory birds and their nests and eggs protected.**

(b) The taking of any migratory bird unlawfully, or the needless disturbance or destruction of a migratory bird's nest or eggs, shall be considered a separate offense, except as provided in section 3 herein.

**Open season on migratory birds.**

(c) The open season on certain migratory game birds as provided in the federal migratory bird treaty regulations is as follows: In Mississippi Sora and other rails (except coot and gallinules) September 1st, to November 30th, woodcock from November 1st to December 31st, mourning doves from September 1st to September 30th inclusive and November 20th to January 31st. All other migratory game water fowl from November 1st to January 31st.

**Limitations on number that may be killed.**

(d) Any person may take in any one day during the open season prescribed herein not to exceed the following number of migratory game birds: Ducks, (except wood duck and eider duck) twenty-five in the aggregate of all kinds.

Sora—forty. Black bellied and golden plovers and greater and lesser yellow legs—fifteen in the aggregate of all kinds. Brant or wild geese—eight. Rails, coot and gallinules (except sora) twenty-five in the aggregate of all kinds. Wilson snipe, or jack snipe—twenty-five. Woodcock—six. Doves (mourning)—twenty-five.

The taking at any time of any other migratory game birds such as wood ducks (summer ducks), swans, little brown, sand-hill and whooping cranes curlews, sandpipers, stilts, and willet is unlawful under the federal migratory bird treaty regulations—except as provided for breeding or scientific purposes.

**Non-migratory birds—open season on.**

(e) The open season for certain non-migratory game birds shall be in Mississippi for bob-whites (partridges, quails) from November twentieth to February first; for wild turkey from January first to March thirty-first. A person may take in any one day during the open season prescribed therefor herein, not to exceed the following numbers of non-migratory game birds; bob-whits (partridges, quails) fifteen. Wild turkey gobblers in one season, two (turkey hens not to be taken in open or closed season). It shall be unlawful to take at any time in Mississippi any or all other non-migratory game birds, such as ruffled grouse, pheasants and western quail, provided, however, that the plumage of pheasants may be had in possession when brought in from outside of the state.

Sec. 2. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved November 29, 1928.

## CHAPTER 93

## HOUSE BILL No. 274

AN ACT to amend section 7, of chapter 178, of the laws of 1926, so as to change the season for the hunting of squirrels.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That section 7, chapter 178 of the laws of 1926, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

**Game—what is.**

Sec. 7. (a) The following wild animals shall be classed as game: Bear, beaver, deer, fox, opossums, raccoons, rabbits and squirrels.

**Fur-Bearing animals—what are.**

(b) The following game and other animals shall be classed as fur-bearing animals: Beaver, fox, muskrats, opossums, otters, raccoons, rabbits, skunks, weasels and minks, but fur-bearing pelts may be shipped to market during the open sason and for five days thereafter.

**Game—Open season and bag limit on.**

(c) The open season and bag limit on game shall be as follows: Bear, from November 1st to February 28th, season bag limit—one.

Beaver, no open season shall be allowed on beaver until after January 1st, 1930, nor shall their dams and houses be needlessly destroyed. Deer, from November 15th to February 15th, day's bag limit—one; season's bag limit—three; provided, that no doe or spotted fawn be killed at any time and that deer shall not be hunted at night.

Hares and rabbits may be hunted at any time, except as prohibited by section 2 (a). Opossum may be hunted from October 1st to January 15th. Squirrels may be hunted from October 1st to January 1st; day's bag limit, 15. Wild cats may be hunted at any time.

There shall be no open season on fox. It shall be unlawful to scare, drive, force, or dig one out of the ground, or to scare, knock, or shoot one out of a tree, or to fell a tree on which there is a fox, provided, however, it shall be lawful to chase a fox with hounds, or allow hounds to kill them on the ground in chase, from August 1st to March 1st.

The open season on raccoons shall be from November 15th to February 1st.

**Fur-Bearing Animals—Open season for.**

However, the proprietor of a musk rat preserve, where musk rats are propagated by such proprietor for commercial purposes, and for which is paid a privilege tax to operate, may trap such musk rats on such preserve, during the months of December, January and February.

**Not to be hunted out of their natural habitat.**

(e) Game, fur-bearing animals, or birds running out of their natural habitat by high water or fire shall not be hunted until conditions permit their return to their regular haunts.

**Certain animals may be killed when doing harm.**

(f) The following animals may be killed when doing harm, by owners or tenants, upon their holdings or by officers of the law, at any time: Mink, skunks, opossum and weasels.

Sec. 2. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved December 1, 1928.

## CHAPTER 92

### SENATE BILL No. 134

AN ACT to amend Section 19 of Chapter 178 of the Laws of Mississippi for the year 1926, so as to further extend the authority of Boards of Supervisors in the regulation of the manner in which game birds, game and fish may be taken.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That Section 19 of Chapter 178 of the 1926 laws of Mississippi be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 19. The board of supervisors may adopt and from time to time modify or repeal such regulations as they may deem necessary or proper for the further protection and preservation of birds, game, and fish in their respective counties, and the manner in which and the circumstances under which birds, game and fish may be taken and by whom and in what quantity and to what extent, and may entirely prohibit the taking of any certain species of birds, game or fish for one or more years. Provided, however, that the board of supervisors cannot and shall not adopt any order or resolution contrary to the provisions of this act, or favoring residents of any one county as against the residents of any other counties within this state.

Sec. 2. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved November 23, 1928.

## CHAPTER 63

## SENATE BILL No. 92

AN ACT to amend Section 17, of Chapter 178 of the Laws of Mississippi, 1926, so as to authorize the Board of Supervisors to appropriate money out of the "Bird, Game and Fish Fund," for the purpose of restocking and replenishing the game supply of the county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That Section 17 of Chapter 178 of the laws of Mississippi of 1926, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

All license fees and fines shall go into a fund and be kept as other county funds are kept, and shall be known as the "Bird, Game and Fish Fund," and same shall be used by the board of supervisors in paying any warden, deputies or other person employed to carry out the provisions of this act, and any other expenses connected with the operation of this act, and in the purchase of birds, game and fish for restocking and replenishing the game supply of the county.

Sec. 2. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved November 12, 1928.

## CHAPTER 53

## HOUSE BILL No. 104

AN ACT to provide for the Maintenance of Golden Pheasant reserves and to regulate the same.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That the proprietor of a golden pheasant reserve, where golden pheasants are propagated by such proprietor, may take the same on such preserve during the months of December, January and February.

Sec. 2. That sub-section E of section 2, chapter 178 of the laws of 1926 shall not apply to such proprietor.

Sec. 3. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved November 19, 1928.

## HOUSE BILL No. 59

AN ACT to prohibit the trapping of Bob Whites (Qualls, Partridges), except by certain officials; prohibiting shipping or taking same out of the state; prescribing by whom and how the same may be shipped within the state; providing penalty for violation, and repealing laws in conflict herewith.

Sec. 1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, That it shall be unlawful for any person, at any time, to set, place, or operate any trap, net, snare, or like device, with the intent of taking, capturing, or killing Bob Whites (Quail, Partridges). It shall further be unlawful for any person to take, capture, snare, or kill any Bob White (Quail, Partridge) with any trap, net, snare, or like device, and each such bird so captured or killed, shall constitute a separate offense. Provided,

however, that this section shall not apply to a Game Warden or Deputy Game Warden when authorized by an Order duly passed and entered upon the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors of the County, designating the time, place, and quantity of such birds as may be captured or trapped by said Warden or Deputy, for the purpose of propagation or restocking on preserves or refuges of the State of Mississippi or any County thereof, or depleted areas of such County. Provided, further that this section shall not apply to such birds when the same have been raised in captivity.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to ship, take, or convey Bob Whites (Quail, Partridges), out of the State; and, it shall be unlawful for any railway, express company, bus line, common carrier, or the owner or operator of any truck or conveyance, to accept for transportation, or to transport or convey any Bob White (Quail, Partridges) to a point outside of the State, or any town situated partly in this State and partly in another, or to any point within the State, with the intent of taking or having the same taken out of the State. Provided, nothing in this act shall prevent the shipment or transportation of Bob Whites (Quail, Partridges), by a duly constituted game warden or deputy, to towns wholly within the State, when such birds have been captured as provided by this act, and when consigned to an official Game Warden or Deputy of any other County in the State, which Warden or Deputy is authorized by the Board of his county to receive same and to use same for propagation in such county. A written statement signed by the official shipping such birds, setting forth the date of the order permitting the taking and shipping, and a like statement from the official to whom consigned and delivered, stating the purpose for which the birds are to be used, giving the date of the order permitting their receipt and disposition, shall be required by the carrier, agent, or person receiving, transporting, or conveying such birds from one point to another wholly within the State. Such statements shall be subject to inspection by any law enforcement officer of the county in which the same was given.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this act in reference to shipping, taking, or conveying out of this State any Bob White (Quail, Partridge, shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than Ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than One hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense; and each bird shipped or carried out of the State, in violation of this act, shall constitute a separate offense.

Sec. 4. That Section 5380 of Hemingway's Code of 1927, Chapter 2 of the laws of 1928, and all other laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith, be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

Sec. 5. That if any section, paragraph, sentence, or clause of this act shall be declared unconstitutional or illegal, such unconstitutionality or illegality shall not effect or destroy any other part, provision, or section of this act.

Sec. 6. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

The urban population increased at a rate of 25.2 per cent, while that of the rural districts, including the villages and towns under 2,500 population, was 3.4 per cent. For the strictly farm territory, the rate was 3.2 per cent, and that of the villages was 4.7 per cent.

Salary of the President

The salary of the president of the United States was the cause of discussion in the first congress, in view of the fact that the constitution declared that the president should receive compensation for his services. Washington had notified his fellow citizens that he desired no salary. The limits suggested in congress ranged from \$15,000 to \$70,000. The salary was finally placed at \$25,000, and this remained the compensation until President Grant's second term (March 3, 1873) when it was increased to \$50,000. Chapter 2918 of the laws of the second session of the fifty-ninth congress, approved March 4, 1907, appropriated "for traveling expenses of the president of the United States, to be expended at his discretion and accounted for by his certificate solely, \$25,000." In the second session of the sixtieth congress the matter of increasing the president's salary was again considered, and it was decided that the president's salary be fixed at \$75,000 a year.

#### Foreign Consuls Resident in Oregon

A number of the foreign nations maintain consuls and vice consuls in Oregon. The principal duties of these officials are: To promote and encourage commercial navigation; to extend and stimulate trade relations between the area or jurisdiction covered by the consulate and the country represented, and between all other foreign nations to enter and clear vessels, sign on sailors and pay those discharged while in port, and keep a list of deserters, take care of sick sailors and of the effects of any that die; to perform notarial work on documents relating to the home country; to look after the interest of the subjects of the country represented by the consulate; to register births, deaths and marriages of their countrymen; to make reports on agricultural and manufacturing conditions, on imports and exports, on harbor improvements and railroad construction, and on new laws and legal decisions of general scope. Official matters may be taken up with the consulates by correspondence or through personal interviews. Consuls in official correspondence should not be addressed by name, but only by consulate.
