My dearest Mother.

Have just returned from the range and had supper. I have only a few minutes but will write you so as to let you hear from me. I am feeling fine and truly I am kept busy. I wanted to send a Xmas cable home but they are forbidden.

I received two registers this
afternoon that were printed
in September. Mother, I am
kept so busy but still I
often think of home and
will be more than happy
when the day comes for me
to return. Never in my life
have I needed the strength
and the wisdom to be always
on the right as I do now.

Pray for me every day that I may
choose the proper way to do things.

I will soon have my chance to
lead men where one small mistake
will mean their death. To really
learn this game well, it is about
the hardest thing that I have ever
tried to do.

We hope to have two days holidays
at Xmas and I expect to leave here
about the 22nd or 28th but I really don't
know yet. Will have to close as there
is so little news to tell. With
love to you and Daddy and to
Mr & Mrs Frierson.
