Dec. 22 1917

My dearest Mother,

I have received your
Special delivery and one
other letter from you since
writing to you and they
were both written several
days before the two that I
received from you on
Monday. I also received
a fine letter from
Bro. W. S. Allen and one

in same mail from Miss.
Bettie Shuford but I have
not yet received the package
from the Church. The other
people that you said
had written have not
yet been heard from.

I am leaving here next
Friday and I hope the
packages arrive before
then. Mother I have gone
through here with out any

credit to myself but there were none
to be promoted so I will have a good
chance to do better with the regiments.
I like the practical method the best and
I want no more promotion
until I have fully learned much
more about artillery than I now
know. I ~~do~~ feel very confident
that I will make a much better
record ~~to~~ with the new assignment.
There will be no chance for me
to come home soon and I really
would not like to come back
as an instructor until I have

front. I received a
bunch of the Mississippi
Collegians and noticed
the letter from Daddy
inclosing check for
my endowment note

to be paid next September.
It is good to know

home which, you have
mentioned in your letters
still think about me.

I miss the comforts
of home but I am
having very comfortable

quarters over here. I am glad "Tete"
has been going with you to Sunday
School and I knew that you
would like him if you ever
knew him well. He has lots of
ways that are similar to mine
and that is why we always get
along so well. I hope he will join
the service soon and feel sure
that he will. With much love to
you and Daddy.
