Mother, they will never know how much pleasure it has brought

me to have those noble people of Lyon
think of me. I hope every one of them
will think of me in their prayers and
pray that I may put forth my
best efforts at all times. The packages

soon. The bunch as a whole
were unusually lucky in the
many Xmas packages received
and I have been eating fruit
cake and candies for 3 solid
days. I will from now on
be a member of The Rainbow Division.

as I have to get up early in the
morning and do some traveling.
