Persons frequently transmit papers to this office without any letter shewing by whom they are sent. All such papers will hereafter be placed on our files - and there remain until the necessary enquiry is made by the parties. Can you see to it - 19

By this you will recollect I am claiming for my self (and accordingly have sent you my declaration in my own name. Not being apprised that it was or is necessary for any other person to certify or attest that I was claiming in my own name or for my self. But if there is any thing further necessary for me to comply with the self affidavit will please inform me what it is and if I can consent with truth as fact necessary -

To have and to hold said Lot of Land to the proper use and behoof of the said Party of the second Part his heirs and assigns for ever free from the lawful claim or claims of all and every Person or Persons whatsoever in testimony where of the said Party of the first Part have here unto set his hand and seal the day year above written
