Feb 4<sup>th</sup> 1918.

My dearest Mother.

I am fine & day, of intending writing a long letter last night but just as I was about to start I received orders to report at once for some work last night and by the time I had finished it was too late.

Went to church for the first time last night since I have been here and enjoyed it fine. It was the first opportunity that I had had for it was the first one <sup>(sermon)</sup> we have had since before Kansas. The regimental band played for 40 minutes and it certainly did put the life into our systems. The chaplain said if we had one

more here to-night that the house would be overflowing and he was right.

Send me some sweets such as Hershey's chocolate, gum or fruit cake would be gladly accepted.

This is just a note as I have another formation to attend and too I have to pull on my rubber boots. It is raining hard. Put in a bottle of Lichenor's Antiruptic when you send me a package as it can be used when my friends receive a sprain or a kick by a horse as one did this am.
