My dearest Mother,

Just a little note this morning to see if I can still talk english. I have been assigned to a French Battery that is on the front and am learning very much real artillery. I have so far been with the division

of an groupe commander who
is in charge of 3 Batteries.

So you see we live very
high but one of the officers
only can speak a little english.

So most of our conversation

is in French but even yet

I do not speak it fluently.

My orderly will arrive to-day

with 2. saddle horses for

me. I sent him back

to my battery ^{the day before} yesterday to get a
horse. I hope to go back to my
battery that is also at the front
in a month. I like the life
fine up here. Last night everything
was quiet until half past two and
in one second it sounded
like every thing broke loose and
the Germans made an attack but
without any success whatever.

Give my love to all and remember
how much I love you my dear Mother.
