My dear Mother,

Last night after supper my orderly came in with your letter written Feb. 10th in Biloxi. I

was indeed glad to hear from you. I wrote to you yesterday

telling you why I was here for three or four days next.

It would be very nice except

There is no one here to chat
with. I feel like to-day after
having sulphur baths yesterday
steaming hot that the little
bugs are about all gone. I

am well otherwise as I ever
was and happy to-know
that every one at home is
well. The americans have
had several small successes

in the last day or two but nothing large enough for much credit. Everything is in fine shape up on the front.

In your letter you speak of the "girls" so often but I can't imagine who it is with Lucia and you and Coz. Nettie. at Biloxi. I presume you have written all about who was going in your former letter which is on the way somewhere.

I am growing a fine mustache and it makes me look much older when I give it another week. Most all wear them over here. Especially all the French.

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I have a nice room and
up until this morning a
French Captain was also
here with me but this
morning he has fully recovered
and went back to join
his troops.

I wish I could spend
a few days at Bibei with
you. But don't ever worry
about me for I will

get along alright.⁵

I don't see any chance of getting home for at least 1 1/2 to two years. I saw not censor but it is the privilege of all officers to sign their own mail. When with my Battery the mail is divided and I censor 1/4 of it. Roulhas is in Aerial Observation and I could not tell you where he is for I have not heard from him in a month. He will make good any where. Monk is with a Battery A. instead of D. where he was at first. He ~~is~~ ^{is} in charge ~~with the~~

of the horses for his
Battery. Mr Crummen is
near here somewhere
and I am expecting
him over here to see me
to-night. if my orderly
gets a message to him
for me. He is a fine
boy and has one of

the biggest hearts in the
world. I don't know where
Kelly is as he is with
the Billeting group of
our Regiment.

Afferson and Mc Crummen
will write to you if any-
thing happens to me so
do not be worried.

Give my love to each and
every one of the ~~house-~~
folks.
