My dearest Mother.

I have just written a letter to Harry Moore and I find my paper has been almost completely demolished. But I have two or three half sheets and will write you any-way. Yesterday I wrote quite a bunch of letters as I thought it was a fine time to catch up with my correspondence.

I have written to "Mike", "Pete", uncles Jennie and Mattie, Hamblet, Joe and Rivers, Harry, etc. I have written

to you every day since I came here.
In some of your letters about Knas
Times you mentioned several parties
sending me Knas pkgs for instance
Coy Ritchie and Mrs. Cagle are two
that I remember. Neither one of
these packages have ever arrived
and I am afraid they will
think that I am very impolite
in not sending them a letter
of thanks. I wish you would
call them sometimes and
thank them for me and tell
them that I have never rec'd
the packages but I appreciate their
thoughtfulness just the same.

I have written a letter of thanks for every package received. Did Bro. Allen ever get my letter of thanks for the kodak sent me by the church. I hope so.

I certainly have enjoyed your letters, they are fine. I

have read them many times.

The one describing Xmas day at home and the Xmas tree almost made me cry like a boy again. I at least drop a couple of tears for joy to know that the Xmas day

at home was so beautiful and all were so happy. Mother you expressed the meaning of that letter very beautifully and I will long remember it.

Yesterday afternoon two of the French officers came in to see me. I had been located with them for a week and they are fine men. They wanted to know when they could look for me again. They make great
