Neither one of These factages have ever arrived and fam afraid they will Think that fam very impolite in not sending them a letter of Thought. I wish you would call them sometimes and Thank them for me and tell Them that I have never recid the puckages but of appreciate their

I have written a letter of thanks for every fuchage received. Did Bro. allen ever get my letter of Thanks for the Rodal sent me by the church of hope so. Jeertainly have enjoyed your letters, they are fine of have read them many times. The one describing Tomas day at home and the Umas tree almost made me cry like a boy again. at home was so beautiful and all were so happy. Mother you explusied the meaning of That letter very beautifully and of will long remember Yesterday afternoon two of the French officers came in to see me.
