My dear Mother!

This morning received the  
copy of "Life" and one copy of  
the "Mississippi Collegian." Yesterday  
received pears of jam, 1<sup>st</sup> and  
a fruit cake from Aunt  
Lennie sent in November. Am  
feeling fine to-day. Just returned  
from a visit to front line  
trenches.

One of the lieutenants of  
my Battery wounded here  
to-day but it is not serious.  
Will only take three months  
in hospital. He is on same  
assignment as I am and  
came over to see me yesterday  
afternoon spending the after-  
noon as I was showing  
him my location.

It was a fine time

to receive the cake as I am  
here with the french. It was  
not very dry either, kept well.

Mother, will not write longer  
to-night as I have just finished  
a letter of thanks to Mrs. Skipwith  
for magazine sent me and one  
to Aunt Fannie.

Write more next time.
