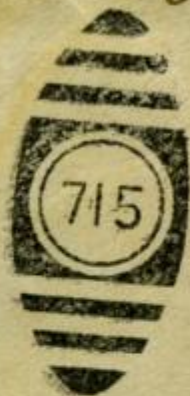

My own dear Mother.

^{this a.m.} I had a fine letter from you
written Feb 28th but was sorry to
hear that you had been operated
on but am certainly glad that it
was successful. He must take good
care of him-self and everything will
be alright again soon.

I haven't had a chance the last
few days to write and there
there has been no way to mail
letters. Do not worry about me
for I am fine. There too I am
with a good organization and
that is why I have stayed here
in preference to returning ^{home} as an
instructor. Too I am needed more
here at this time. My Captain, said

that I must not go back for he
did not believe I was one of the
kind who would sit back at home.

It is evident that there will
be more struggles like Verdun this
year and now is the time when
it has commenced. I wish the U.S.A.
and especially the people could get
a clearer view of the war.

Those at home have absolutely no
idea of the facts. In other words
they have been almost asleep for the
past several years.

The letter from Bro. Allen
a few days ago ~~has~~ ^{has} given
me much pleasure. The poems
and clippings have been read many

times. Then too I was glad to know my church was remembering me in the prayers of its members.

I am with my battery and we are having a few days rest. The country is the most beautiful that I have ever seen with out exception.

Remember that no news is good news for when any thing of consequence happens to me, you shall know immediately.

Excuse the paper but it is some received several days ago from Y.M.C.A. and I have been carrying in my pocket.

Love to all. Tell Joe I think of him and know he will soon be OK.
