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

WHAT IS COOPERATIVE DISTRIBUTIVE EDUCATION?

Distributive Education is a combination of study and on-the-job training program which is provided by the public school system. The purpose of the program is to improve the efficiency of persons engaged in distribution and marketing occupations. The students receive classroom instruction directly related to their work experience in the cooperating establishments.

The employer supervises the trainee's on-the-job activities. The students take academic subjects required for graduation and at least one period in Distributive Education. Credit is given for both the work experience training and classroom participation.

This cooperative program may be offered in addition to the Preparatory Distributive Education Program.

HOW DOES THIS COOPERATIVE PROGRAM WORK?

ON THE JOB



The student is placed in an approved distributive occupation by the coordinator. The training composed of a minimum of 15 hours per week, is supervised by the employer and the local D. E. teacher coordinator.

The student receives a salary for his work experience similar to any beginner's pay. The student is evaluated by the employer at the end of each school term.

Upon completion of his job training, the student should be adequately trained for full time employment in the job for which he is trained.

IN THE CLASSROOM



The Cooperative Distributive Education program includes instruction in many areas of business, such as: courses in advertising display, employer-employee relations, selling, buying, communications and many others. The classroom training is closely correlated with the student's vocational objective in the field of distribution and marketing. Business leaders in the community assist the teacher-coordinator and the students with up-to-date materials on business trends and procedures.

14 years of age or older.

Either a Junior or Senior.

Satisfactory school grades.

Good citizenship and attendance records.

A pleasing personality.

A wholesome attitude toward study and work.

A definite vocational objective in the field of distribution and marketing.
