My dear Dr. Silver,

Sir Archibald Gordon at the British Embassy has been helping to fix up my itinerary in this country and I now have much pleasure in writing to confirm what he said to you in his letter of December 7th. I do expect to be in St. Louis, Missouri, on January 4th and 5th and according to my present plans, I would then proceed by road (as I shall then have the use of a car) to your campus at Mississippi. Perhaps I may be allowed to write to you again nearer the time to indicate more precisely the exact time of my arrival.
