Last night I received
a bunch of mail;

it was a fine picture
and I would certainly
like to hear her jolly
laugh again.

The work now is
quite strenuous. But I
manage to get along
very well. As the men
say when things are not
going good, "It is a
bad war."

It is very hard to find
time to write the past few
days and I know my
letters are not very
interesting. I also received
a letter from "Pete" and

two days ago I received
one from Miss. Willie
Davidson, of Lyon. I am
always glad to hear
from my friends and
it pleases me greatly
to receive letters from
them.

There is very little war
news as we are kept
busy fighting. Although

our casualties are very small considering. But I knock on wood for fear our good luck will change.

I still think I was wise to stay over here and not come back as instructor to the states.

I am learning something new every day and much of it. After a year I would gladly accept but not before.
