April 20 1900.

My dear Mother & Father:-

Monday morning - 8 - A.M.

I have just finished breakfast and half an hour
is mine before going out to "Applied psychology" - in
plain English Pedagogy.

Your last letter was received
late last night. I had been to church with
the librarian - my Platonic friend - and then
walked out to the campus to call on a
Jackson girl visiting one of the professors.
When we started home I had to open my
post-office box in order to let another
couple get ahead of us. I got your letter

and also succeeded in being the last couple.
