WHEREAS, The University of Mississippi Faculty, its Provost and Chancellor and its Governing Board have long embraced a commitment of shared governance;


WHEREAS, The University of Mississippi Faculty Senate is the elected and representative body of the faculty and help to establish and implement governance essential in operating a flagship university;
