I am getting along very well. There are many changes being made at all times and I never know when it is my time to be sent to some other outfit. Some

of our best men and two of our officers are on detached service.

We had a little excitement last night

but that was about  
all. The Traches have made  
several unsuccessful at-  
tempts with us lately.

Your fine letter came  
last night with the  
clipping of Mrs. Jefferson.  
I haven't heard from him

lately. I had a fine  
letter from Albert  
Masley last night, and  
also one from Mrs  
Pendar. Both fine.

I am glad you got  
my personal letter to you  
all O.K. Mother, I was  
proud to hear that you  
were a Capt in the  
Red Cross work, Mother,  
you are always in  
my thoughts and I  
love you more all  
the time. The picture of  
John Apperson is very  
good. He has a won-  
derful personality.

I knew that Harry  
Moore would join  
and he has written  
me many good letters  
of cheer, I was glad  
to hear of his step in  
joining the church.
