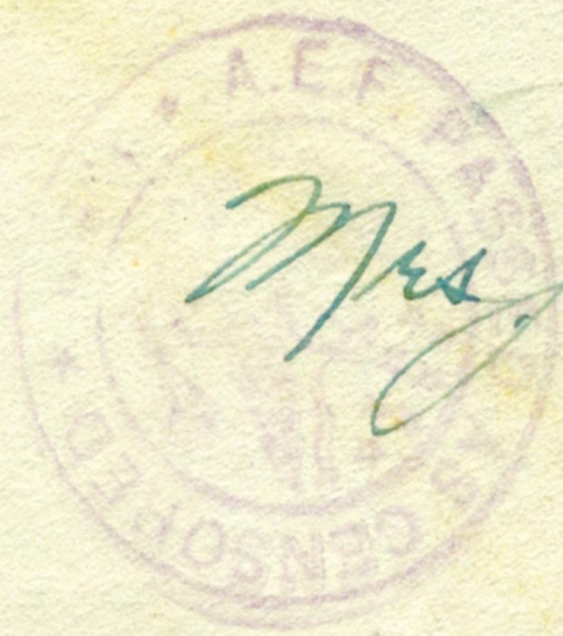

My dearest Mother,

I just received yours
of 13th May and enjoyed
it. I am in very
good health. I also
had a letter from
Rivers. He is a great
young man. Do not
expect much mail
for me now for
a while. But do not
worry. John W Brown
a friend of mine
left for the states
this morning as
an instructor. He was
in same battery and

has been living in
same dug out with
me for some time, He
took your address
and said he would
drop you a line to
let you know how
I was getting along.
Also a good friend
of mine from Memphis
returned in same
bunch and he was
Edw. Smith from
Memphis but I did
not get to see him
before he left. But
they are supposed to
love the best for

the greater work to
be done over here so
I am glad to stay
here with the regiment.
I have much work
to do now as we
have had three of
our best lieutenants
transferred in a week
time. I am always
looking for my time
to get away but I
am glad to get
this better experience
and then I feel
better up here than
being an instructor.
Mother, I will

not write a long letter
to - night as I am
somewhat sleepy and
every day is my
day as officer because
The Capt is the only
one here with me.

Much love to all
the home folks.
