Rosalie M. Gordon, a well-known New York writer, says that the red hand is working in New York schools.

Rosalie M. Gordon has spent more than twenty-five years in research and in writing and has written a factual report as to the workings of the Communists in the New York schools.

Her article appeared on March 15, 1957 in Economic Council Letter No. 403, printed and distributed by the National Economic Council, Inc., located in the Empire State Building in New York City.

Factual Report

This factual article detailing the work of the Communists in New York City schools follows in full:

"American communists and their dupes operate on a cardinal axiom: Where there is no problem, make one! They are well aware of the fact that the chains of collectivism cannot be bound around a free people unless they are first torn by dissension, hatred, intolerance and fear.

"The people of the City of New York are now being presented with a perfect example of this technique of creating a problem where none has existed. The leftist groups have chosen as their strategic weapon the touchy subject of integration and as their field of battle, the public schools.

Havoc In South

"The forces of dissension, having wrought havoc in the South, have now turned their attention to the North. In the South, of course, a problem did and does exist — one that was greatly intensified when a packed Supreme Court, arrogating to itself unconstitutional law-making powers, stepped into the picture to compound the work of the trouble-makers. But in the North—and particularly in New York City — there was no problem. The schools of New York City have always been integrated. It never occurred to a citizen of New York that the school to which he sent his children should not also be attended by the children of Negro parents living in the same neighborhood or school district. School attendance was not bound by considerations of race, creed or nationality. The boundaries, rightly, were those of geography and convenience. Naturally, due to the normal congregation of like-minded people in certain areas in a city as large as New York, this led to some schools having a predominantly white or a predominantly Negro population. It also led to some schools having a predominantly Irish or Italian or German or Chinese (as in New York's Chinatown) population, but no one has yet suggested that

This column has been trying to put over the idea that the thing that we need in the South is leadership.

We have been crying for leadership with the courage and the brains to stand up and fight for the rights of the white people everywhere.

While we have been doing so we have been pointing with pride to some of our leaders from Georgia.

We have been pointing with pride to Herman Talmadge while he was governor, and now as United States Senator.

We have pointed with pride to Marvin Griffin whom we think has more nerve and more courage to stand up and fight for the white people than any governor we know.

We have been pointing with pride to some of our Congressmen and especially Jim Davis, "Tic" Forrester and Jack Flint.

They have been outstanding in their fight for the white people and for the South.

We have been saying that the reason we are in the fix we are in today has been due to a lack of leadership.

If Southern Congressmen and Southern Senators had been united and stood up for the rights of the white people as they should, we would have never had the Supreme Court decisions against segregation.

We have always believed that our leaders in Washington and in the governors' offices over the South misled the Supreme Court into believing that the people of the South were ready to accept race mixing.

They judged our attitude by the attitude of our leaders in Washington.

Before the Supreme Court decisions we had already had a lot of race mixing in Washington. The various departments in Washington have been race-mixed.

Yet, our leaders sat idly by in Washington and said and did nothing to prevent it. They didn't even protest.

Then we saw President Truman begin the process of race mixing in the armed forces. Even though we had a Democratic administration Southern Democrats did not rise up against Truman. They did not rise up against his race mixing in the armed forces.

When Eisenhower came into power he completed the process of race mixing in the armed forces. Yet, our powerful members of Congress from the South said nothing and did nothing to stop it.

Consequently, we believe that the Supreme Court was misled into believing that the people of the South would follow the example set by their leaders in Washington when the departments in Washington were race mixed and when the armed forces were race mixed.

Southern leaders in Washington at the time these things happened were in positions powerful enough to prevent the race mixing in the departments and in the armed forces.

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YOUR GOVERNOR REPORTS

Below we quote from Governor Griffin's message to the legislature delivered on Tuesday, January 15, 1957:

Industry Growth

We are all proud of the fact that Georgia is now making the greatest progress in its history in the location of new industries in this State.

An intensive national advertising campaign is being carried out by the Georgia State Department of Commerce in cooperation with private enterprise on a 50/50 basis. Its purpose is to spotlight before the nation the prime advantages our State possesses as a location for business and industrial opportunities.

The State also has extended every cooperation to the Georgia State Chamber of Commerce which sponsors pilgrimages by representative citizens to major trade and manufacturing centers of the east and mid-west. The purpose of these missions is not to pirate existing industry in those sections but to create a reservoir of good will for Georgia among the country's top business leaders.

It has been my privilege to speak to businessmen and industrial executives in New York, Chicago, Cleveland and Detroit and I plan to tell "the Georgia Story" in many other Cities during the next two years.

Year-end reports of the Georgia State Department of Commerce and the Georgia State Chamber of Commerce reveal that for the past four consecutive years your State has led the entire South in the number of new industries established.

During 1956 a total of 360 new factories, large and small, were built costing \$165 million dollars in capital expenditures. These plans are providing eleven thousand new jobs for Georgians with an increase in the annual payroll of \$32 million dollars.

These figures do not include many expansions by long-established Georgia firms estimated to exceed \$150 million dollars for the year. They, too, will provide thousands of new employment opportunities.

During the 12-month-period over 2,000 new businesses were established within our borders.

Georgia holds fourth place in the nation in the establishment of heavy industries since World War II yielding only to California, Texas and Ohio. She ranks fifth in the rate of increase among all the states in per capita income.

For the first time in Georgia business and industrial employment exceed one million wage earners.

these must be reshuffled.

Plans Are Adopted

But, so far as the racial issue is concerned, the schools of New York always have been integrated—even in the extreme meaning of the term as applied by the Supreme Court. There was, therefore, no problem. But if there was no problem, how could the people of New York—black and white alike—be made conscious of their differences? How could the seeds of dissension be sown. How better than by creating a problem?

"On February 28 last, the Board of Education of New York City adopted a revolutionary program that could well sound the death-knell of the good race relations which have existed in New York for a long time. The program embodies a 'master plan' for the willy-nilly shifting about of the school population of New York. As we have said, there never has been segregation in the New York City schools. But this new master plan contemplates an 'integration' of Negro and Puerto Rican pupils with white pupils which goes far beyond even the radical interpretation of integration given by the Supreme Court.

"The two most important features of the program are known as the 'rezoning plan' and the 'teacher rotation plan.' The school districts of New York, in the elementary grades, have been formed in order to provide school facilities for children on a neighborhood basis, so that young children would not have to walk or ride too far to school. The high schools, though having an older student population able better to cope with the complicated transportation facilities of a large city, still have been placed generally in more or less strategic neighborhoods to cut to a minimum the travelling time of students.

Rezoning System

"Under the rezoning plan, all this will go by the board. School districts will be rezoned without regard to geography or conveniences. The only criterion will be so-called 'integration.' In other words, if there is a school in a district where the student population is predominantly white, the district will be extended or enlarged so as to force some students in a predominantly Negro school to attend the predominantly white school. And if there is a school in a predominantly Negro neighborhood, that district too will be extended or enlarged so as to force white students to go to the predominantly Negro school.

"Obviously, there are areas where this rezoning will be impossible, especially in the larger boroughs where the district lines would be so great as to become ridiculous. In that case, in the words of the plan: 'Special methods for integration may be used, such as permissive zoning, selective bus transportation or change of school.' In plain English, what that means is that Mr. and Mrs. John Smith, who bought a house in a neighborhood convenient to a public school for their Mary and Tommy, may very soon find Mary and Tommy being hauled by bus to another school in another neighborhood with a predominantly Negro or Puerto Rican population. And the same thing will apply to a self-respecting Negro or Puerto Rican family who moved into a neighborhood where their children could go to a school in which they would feel congenial and at home. They may suddenly find their youngsters being transported by bus to another school with a predominantly white population.

Meaning Of Integration

"This, of course, is not an honest attempt to bring about integration, since New York has always had actual integration. School integration means this, and nothing else: That children of school age shall attend their neighborhood schools regardless of race or creed or color. The new plan rejects that completely. It proceeds on the theory that if there are few or no colored children in a school district, then by law a sufficient number of colored children will be literally kidnapped and forced into distant schools. The same treatment will be meted out to white children regardless of the inconveniences to children and parents. This is a clear rejection of a long standing principle of New York's public schools, namely that all children will be looked upon without reference to their color and will be treated—white and colored—alike.

"It will be seen immediately that this plan, put forth presumably to end a non-existent discrimination in New York City schools, actually contemplates a form of discrimination almost beyond belief. One of the organizations opposing the plan puts its finger very accurately on this point. It said: 'Who has the right to decide on which students will travel where? Shall we set up a committee which shall

say which children go to what schools? Up to the present we have not been subjected to discriminatory practices of this kind in New York City; why shall we be now?"

Race Consciousness

"Why, indeed? Why else but to plant among the people of New York the seeds of race consciousness, of discrimination; to set pupil against pupil and parent against parent, depending on whose child is to be sacrificed on the spurious altar of 'racial balance.'

"Even without formal approval, the Board of Education, under pressure from certain groups to which we will come in a moment, has already instituted this plan in selected areas. One assistant superintendent, himself no foe of integration put very succinctly what this program means. As reported by U. S. News and World Report, he said:

"The very act of consciously trying to mix races results in a form of 'segregated' thinking. It used to be that when a child came to me for assignment to a school, I never even thought about his color. I simply sent him to the nearest school that had room and the proper program for him. But now I have to consider that child's color—become conscious of his race—and try to assign him in a way that contributes to racial balance."

Rotation Of Teachers

"The other part of the design — the teacher-rotation plan — involves pretty much the same thing. Teachers who have spent much time and energy studying the needs and guidance problems of pupils in their own schools will be forced to transfer to other schools in strange and distant neighborhoods. Aside from the travelling-time imposed on already overburdened teachers, promotion will no longer depend solely on merit and length of service. It will depend on a teacher spending at least three years in a so-called 'difficult' school. There is a contradiction here of which the promoters of the plan do not seem to be conscious. The rezoning and shifting about of pupils is supposed to make for sweetness and light and no more special difficulties in all the schools of New York. Yet some of the teachers are to be forced to do a tour of duty in schools with 'difficult problems' supposedly eliminated by a rezoning plan!

"The question naturally arises: Who put this plan over — a plan guaranteed to generate race-consciousness and subsequent racial dissension among the people of New York? There is, of course, no implication that the members of the Board of Education or some of the civic groups backing the plan are communist, communist-dominated or even sympathetic to communist or leftist aims. But it is always possible for the leftist groups to get perfectly well-meaning people unknowingly to do their dirty work for them. This is singularly true in the case of a delicate subject like integration, since no New Yorker wishes to be branded a segregationist. Therefore opposition to such a plan is difficult, since those opposed to it are immediately smeared as 'racists' 'intolerant,' 'Negro-haters,' etc.

NAACP Hunts Troubles

"The NAACP—National Association for the Advancement of Colored People—ever since the Supreme Court decision in the Southern segregation cases — has been needling the public officials of New York to force such race-conscious 'integration' as is embodied in this plan. The NAACP presumes, with no authority whatever, to speak for all the colored citizens of America, just as the Anti-Defamation League which cooperates closely with the NAACP, presumes to speak for all the Jewish citizens of America. The NAACP has always denied vehemently that it is communist or communist-dominated. That may be. But the records of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reveal communist, communist-front, fellow-travelling or subversive organizations or activities on the part of the president, chairman of the board, honorary chairman, 11 of 28 vice-presidents, 28 of 47 directors and a number of other officials of the NAACP. In fact, one of its founders — its only Negro founder incidentally—and a leading light is W. E. B. DuBois, who has a communist-front record covering eight single-spaced typewritten pages. Though President Eisenhower has seen fit to send greetings to the NAACP, his State Department is unable to issue a passport to DuBois because of his unsavory record.

Who They Are

"In any case, following the needling from the NAACP, and a blast about 'segregation' in New York from a psychology professor at City College, a study was

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People Of Clinton Continue Fight Against Race-Mixing

New Newspaper Joins In Battle To Save Town's Public Schools

Clinton, Tennessee is still fighting. The people of that area stand together from ninety-five to ninety-eight percent strong.

Only a little handful of people join with Governor Clement in the effort to integrate the public schools of that Tennessee town.

The county school board has called on their representative in the legislature to introduce a resolution in the legislature calling on Governor Clement to remove the Negro students from Clinton High School.

New Newspaper

The resolution was unanimously adopted by the school board.

As a result of the controversy in Clinton, a new newspaper has been established in the town.

It was established by Leo Ely and the issue of March 15th was the tenth issue of the East Tennessee Reporter.

In ten weeks it has grown to a six-page edition and is receiving almost universal support in Anderson County where Clinton is the county seat.

"The Price Of Glory"

Writing in the issue of March 15th, 1957 in reference to the Clinton situation, the editor, in an article entitled "The Price of Glory," said:

"How many families will be moving away from Clinton?

"How many children will be removed from the Clinton High School and placed in other schools?

"How many children will be expelled from the school?

"How many citizens will eventually be arrested under unprecedented federal charges?

"How many times will Anderson county turn against Anderson county?"

"NOW! How many more heretofore sane and rational people will be driven literally mad, literally crazy, by the machinations of a disreputable and conformist judicial branch of this g-r-e-a-t, and freedom-loving country of ours.

"The first one—as a matter of record—was put in the place of padded cells this week.

"A year ago there were those in Clinton who said it couldn't happen here. It did happen. The school was officially integrated.

Is there one among you who would not have said, 'A man cannot be driven insane by these shenanigans?' It has happened.

"In the words of our hypocritical governor, 'How long, oh, how long, Americans!' Let's ask, 'How long, oh, how long, Clintonians, until you heed that a terrible farce has been worked in your midst?'"

"The Supreme Court said they based their decisions primarily upon sociological and psychological principles.

"Please answer the foregoing question to yourself and then ask how reasonable can they be. How sociologically and psychologically stable is Clinton today?"

"How much and how many of the old comforts and the old happy days will have to be given up before we admit to ourselves that someone is trying to shove something down our throats which is not only distasteful but is not good for us? We are speaking of the colored, as well as the white, race.

"If John Gates' mind is permanently impaired, who will his family blame for it? For heaven's sake, who can they blame?"

"He went through hell as an infantryman but had to come home to crack up!"

"The father of our country, George Washington, warned that the usurpation of power is a corrupting force. In his Farewell Address he said:

"The Constitution which at any time exists till changed by an explicit and authentic act of the whole people is sacredly obligatory upon all."

"Let there be no change by usurpation; for though there in one instance may be the instrument of good, it is the customary weapon by which free governments are destroyed."

"Who can deny that men are being destroyed by the usurpation of the constitution now? Who can deny that rights are being denied, when children are being dragged from their place of learning in search of another where they and their families can enjoy the rights which they have always been accustomed to?"

"Who can deny that the departure of

the South? This question is being asked by an increasing number of Southerners as well as readers in other sections of the country.

"The best answer that we can think of is this: Her leadership—or rather, her LACK of it.

"The sad truth, as we see it, is that the South is saddled with entirely too many well-meaning but inept leaders. We seem to have more than our share of outdated, over-cautious 'leaders' — men who are not leaders at all but often occupy important positions in public life through default.

"Of course, we have our valiant sons, as well. Georgia's Judge James C. Davis comes to mind. There's Senator Herman Talmadge, another Georgian. Mississippi has given us Congressman John Bell Williams and Senator James O. Eastland. And there are others. But on the by and large, such men are in the minority in Southern public life.

"The South is burdened down, spiritually and physically, on every level, with 'leaders' who are thirty or more years behind the times. They cling to what they call a middle-of-the-road position, unmindful of the fact that that sort of indecision went out with the horse-and-buggy.

"We are living in an age when everything is accelerated. Things move much faster in every field of human endeavor than they used to do. We can no longer afford the luxury of beating-around-the-bush.

"Professor Richard M. Weaver, writing in the Jan. 19 issue of *The National Review*, had this to say about the classic middle-of-the-road position:

"The middle-of-the-road position is sought by those who are uncomfortable ideas, and the oppositions which these entail . . . they . . . temporize with: 'the truth is always found somewhere in between' . . . This is not only safe, it is also easy, for one never has to undergo the sometimes arduous work of defining a position independently. That labor can be left to the 'extremists,' of whom the Conservative is pictured as one. . . ."

"In short, the middle-of-the-road is a good place for the fainthearted, for the unsure—and for the man who is unable to defend himself and his ideas. But it is no place for men.

"And the South of today has no need for unmanly men. We need men as we have not needed them since the War Between the States. And we shall have them.

"Today the South stands with her back to the wall. She is the last great defender of the Constitution. She is the last stronghold of 'The American Way.' If the South falls, America as it was conceived by our forefathers, falls also. There can be and there will be no recovery from this fall.

"For the fall planned for us will be a fall of our race as well as our institutions, of our genes and hormones as well as our dollars and cents. And no people have ever yet burned the African blood out of their veins, once it entered in.

"One whose ear is attuned to the voice of the people can hear the war drums beating. It is still a muffled sound, but it is growing in volume and it is becoming clearer in definition.

"The great question is, Will God raise us up a champion? Will a man be given to us to whom we can rally? Will one among us arise, who will say, 'I dare to do it! Follow me!'"

"The South today is praying for a voice of authority. There is evidence on all sides that our people are tiring of their silent, middle-of-the-road leadership. One proof of it lies in the fact that the names of many prominent Southern leaders, almost revered until recent months, draw no reaction today but a sneer of disdain. And the contempt which they have brought down on their own heads is slowly dripping down, down, down—to encompass state and local 'leaders,' as well.

"The great revival that is now sweeping the South has carried many of our citizens beyond the frontiers recognized and feared by our leaders. Some of us are resting for a little while, to see if our erstwhile great men can catch up; others are already too impatient and have begun to look for new leaders.

"To those who have asked, What's wrong with the South? we say again, Her leadership. And we add: Give us a little more time! If some of our corpses now in public life don't find a way to reanimate themselves, we will soon find a way to show you some new men, fit and suited to lead the New South!"

That's a sad confession to make.

It's pitiful to be forced to confess that we haven't had the right kind of leadership in the South.

The Virginian says, "Give us a little more time."

It's even sadder to think that we must ask for more time to get proper leadership.

We agree with the Virginian that:

"If some of our corpses now in public life don't find a way to reanimate themselves, we will soon find a way to show you some new men, fit and suited to lead the New South!"

In most of the states, and in a lot of the Congressional Districts, we need to clean house. We need a new bunch of United States Senators. We need some new governors and we need some new Congressmen.

We feel that it is going to take until 1960 to clean house in the South. To do it by 1960 it is going to be necessary for the people all over the South to get busy.

96 Billion Dollars

It is true that the appropriations bill introduced in Congress only calls for the appropriation of seventy-one billion dollars. The reason for the difference between the seventy-one billion and the ninety-six billion is because other income taken in by the government is not counted since it doesn't require an appropriation out of the treasury.

But the federal government will spend this year ninety - six billion dollars in regular budget funds.

The government may spend more because most all of the agencies of the government have accumulations of expenditures already authorized and which are now unexpended.

Foreign Donations

Take aid to foreign countries, for instance. There is approximately two billion dollars of unexpended funds built up in this source alone.

So, there is no way to tell how much money the federal government could possibly spend in the next fiscal year.

This all points up the fact that the haphazard, harem-scarem way in which the federal government is operated means that the public is getting robbed.

Congress Controls Spending

Southerners have an additional reason for favoring tax reduction. We know that if you trim these wildcat agencies down that are trying to put into effect the communistic and socialistic theories that they won't be able to do too much damage to us when the water is cut off.

Just a few minutes' study of this kind of a situation brings home to us the idea that we have created in the Nation's capital a mighty octopus which is growing bigger and fatter every day and this octopus is gradually destroying and killing the people of the nation.

It is up to the Congress of the United States. It is up to your Senators and Congressmen. They have an opportunity to start taking some of this load off your back now if they will just do it.

Cut Budget Now

The present budget is before the Congress and they can start whittling it down to where it ought to be.

It ought to be cut by at least ten percent this year. Seven billion dollars at least should be cut out of it.

It can be very easily done in two places alone: They can cut out foreign aid and they can trim the wild extravagance of the armed forces.

Need Men Of Integrity

But seven billion dollars ought to be just the starter. They ought to trim all of these other agencies. They ought to get rid of all the worthless employees and the worthless boards, bureaus and agencies that are wasting and spending the money of the people of this nation from one end of the earth to the other.

It is going to take backbone and courage for a Congressman to stand up and vote for such slashes, but now is the time for nerve and courage and if they haven't got the nerve and the courage to do the job, then get you some Congressman who will do the job.

South Deering Chicago Citizens Uphold Racial Segregation

Southeast Economist Reports Big Influx Of Negroes To Windy City Makes Trouble

The gallant community of South Deering in Chicago is still standing pat. No Negro is permitted to walk on the streets of South Deering either day or night to this good day.

The social planners and the eggheads of Chicago tried to move thirty-five Negro families into a housing project in Trumbull Park nearly four years ago.

It took 2100 policemen to keep these 35 families in the housing project.

Continued To Fight

But the South Deering community didn't quit. They still fought and they are still fighting.

These 35 families have been reduced to nine.

The people of South Deering are now saying that they are 26 down and only nine to go.

Last summer, when the writer was in Chicago, there were 75 policemen guarding these families. The police haul them in police cars in and out of the community. They haul the children to school outside of the community in police cars.

Overwhelming Odds

Recently, the South Deering Bulletin, a weekly paper published by the South Deering Improvement Association, had this to say:

"The gallant stand the community of South Deering has put up against outstanding and overwhelming odds is beginning to shape up.

"At one time the City of Chicago and the CHA forced as high as 35 Negro families into the Trumbull Park Project, but this did not weaken the spirit of the people of South Deering, and now after 45 months of continual vigilance, there is estimated around 9 colored families still holding out, although 20 Negro families are registered.

Year Looks Bright

"In South Deering, the year 1957 looks very bright as the community is tightening its belt to stay in the battle to the very end which will be nothing less than victory.

"To the planners, and men in professional ranks who have been in our community working undercover to try to convert the residents into mixing, we say their efforts are futile, in unity there is strength and South Deering has unity.

"In the project it now stands 26 down and 9 to go."

The cause of this resistance in the South Deering community, where some fifteen thousand people live, is very interesting from the standpoint of a Southerner.

Negroes In Chicago

The Negroes are pouring into Chicago and they are overrunning at least two and half city blocks every week. When they move into a community they overrun it and the people are forced to leave.

Every community in Chicago which has been overrun by Negroes is now reeking with crime. It is unsafe for anybody to walk the streets at night in any of these Negro areas.

All the newspapers are admitting that it is unsafe. Stores and churches near these Negro neighborhoods are forced to close when night comes.

Economical Worries

On March 7, the Southeast Economist, published in Chicago, had an article entitled "Changing Chicago" dealing with this problem of the influx of Negroes.

Here's what the Southeast Economist had to say:

"Public officials report approximately 4,300 are coming here each month from below the Mason-Dixon line, bringing with them problems never before faced by the community.

"Virtually all of them come from conditions of squalor. They never knew any other way of living, nor did their forebears. Most of them are illiterate and many of them do not know the meaning of morals.

Destroying Neighborhoods

"They came in jalopies, by bus and some by train, but, like the locusts that destroy the fields, they are destroying neighborhoods which once were the most comfortable in the city.

"They are not doing so deliberately; their lack of cleanliness, ignorance of even fundamental sanitation, and their willingness, or need, to live with other families of their kind in quarters intend-

HERMAN TALMADGE REPORTS

THERE IS NO reason why the federal budget for 1957-58 should be any greater than that of 1955-56 which totaled \$66.5 billion. By all economic yardsticks, it should be less.

The inflated \$71.8-billion spending bill currently pending before Congress can be cut by at least \$5½ billion without reducing military spending or curtailing a single essential program of civil benefits or services. In addition, several other billions could be saved through the adoption of certain streamlining practices in the operation of the nation's defense establishment.

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THE ONLY EFFECTIVE way to trim government spending without arousing the ire of one group or another, as I learned from my own experience as Governor of Georgia, is through across-the-board budget reductions and refusal to inaugurate new spending programs. With the exception of defense and debt interest requirements, such a formula is needed to cope with the present federal budgetary situation.

In that light, my view is that the proposed budget should be reduced as follows:

- \$1,584,000.00—6% across-the-board reduction in all programs of civil benefits and services.
- \$1,800,000,000—elimination of foreign military aid
- \$451,000,000 — rejection of proposed program of federal aid to education.
- \$85,000,000 — reduction in propaganda spending as recommended by experts in field

\$5,520,000,000—total reduction.

THE ACROSS-THE-BOARD cuts could be absorbed almost entirely through a reduction in federal personnel along the lines recommended by the House Manpower Utilization Subcommittee headed by Georgia Congressman James C. Davis. That Group has found that 400,000 jobs could be eliminated without detriment to federal services or, through the reclassification and consolidation of duties as vacancies occur, without dismissing a single employee.

Tremendous defense savings could be realized through a Congressional review of unexpended appropriations to determine their validity in the light of the latest technological advances as well as through a concerted program to eliminate duplication among the services and to reduce manpower through utilization of latest developments and ideas in weapons and tactics.

Genesis Of Revolution
