that can be done with them - There
was some better feeling in the Market yesterday
evening and Middling sold pretty freely
at 30¢, but the News from New York of
a decline of $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1¢ for the rec^d. to day has
put a damper upon it. I don't think there
will be any Considerable advance in Cotton
but the Market will be fluctuating sometimes
more active than at others & I will try and
keep an active Market to sell on - all well
