I am all set for a nice fourth of July. Happy as can be. Just walked down to a poppy patch and picked this poppy for you. The fields are beautiful. I love to watch the alfalfa, wheat and oats toss in the breezes. Many clovers and grasses look like the same we have back home.

I wrote ^{my} Mattie a letter.

a few minutes ago, I wish
you would send me

of Rivers. I imagine

fast. But Sam still

than I ever was before.

There are many aeroplanes
always in the air
and I think they will
soon have to have
traffic cops up
there.

hear of the smallpox in
the Hodges family. I
hope they will all
soon be well again.

of the fine crops
and hope they will
continue throughout
the year.
