Gentlemen.

Your favor of the 25th inst. is in hand and I to day shipped as ordered (50¢) fifty dollars worth of Ear Corn in 4 bags drayage included. I shipped Ear Corn because it was so difficult to get sound Corn Shelled, and for feeding purposes the ear Corn is much the more desirable, it cost 1.30 per bushel.

Cotton is improving, Middling quoted to day at 30¢ in New York - 25 to 26¢ here - Nothing New. all well. Detail is still in Ark. I wrote to you a few days ago concerning the Pony.
