Mr. Barthe, Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, presented the following report and resolution, which, on motion, were adopted, the rules being dispensed with:

EMANCIPATIONS-SECOND READING.

The Judiciary Committee, to whom have been referred several petitions for emancipations of slaves, beg leave to submit the following report and resolution:

Victor Martin owner of the statu liber Minerva;  
L. J. Mace, owner of the slave Fanny; Jean Fortin,  
owner of the slave Zabette; E. Manderville, owner  
of the slave Auguste; Theo. Hazeur, owner of the  
slaves Louis and Louisa; Mrs. de Armas, owner of  
the slave Victoire-praying for the emancipation  
of their slaves, have complied with the requisites of the laws.  
No oppositions have been filed to the emancipations of the slaves  
who appear, (children excepted) able to make their livelihood.  
Resolved., That the consent of the Council of Municipality No. One

is given to the emancipations of the hereafter named slaves, or  
statu libers, with permission to remain in the State-to wit.
