My dear Mother,

This is another good day for me because there has been many changes and I was allowed to be reassigned to this regiment after having been detached. Not only to the regiment but to my same Battery. Beside this there has been a new 1st Lieut assigned to us with 4 mos. experience on the border and my Captain told me that I was to rank

the new bird.
I am getting along
very nicely. I found
Co. Kate Lunday's letter
this morning and
answered it. I
suppose she thinks
5 months is a
long time to
wait and I
am glad that
you wrote to
her.

Our baggage is
being cut ^{back} to
limit allowed, all
the time, and we
can not carry a
thing beside bedding
roll with a little
extra clothing in-
side. I shipped
my clothing roll

this morning to
a storing place.
