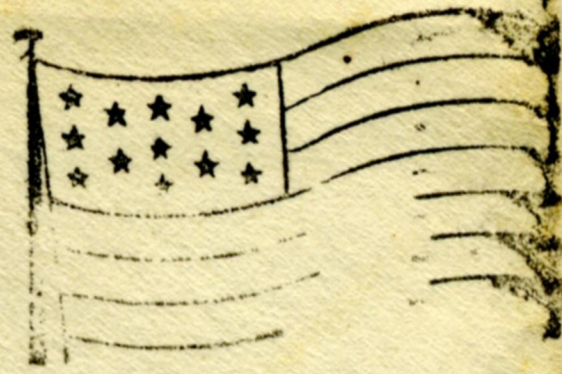

July 26th 1918.
Friday.

My dearest Mother,

While sitting here all alone watching
the twilight fade into night and
wondering what my topic would be
for to-morrow's instruction, I thought
I would write to my dear Mother,
whom I would love to see now.
Mother, although I can't be at Claremont
with you, yet I can look at your picture
that is just in front of me, on
the table. I carry it around in my
pocket in the leather case you sent
with it.

Mother, I would certainly like to
be back with my Battery instead
of being an instructor. Pray that
I may make a good one as

it certainly does go against the grain.
I am the only instructor here at
the present time and we are just
awaiting to get on the range.
Probably get there next week.

Think I will try to get
my new uniform to-morrow
as it should be finished.

Capt. Montgomery said he
was going to move up in
the room here with me
to-night. He is capt of one of
the Batteries that I am with.
I like him very much.

I hope to have some mail
coming in real soon.

I know you are having hot
weather now but the nights are
real cool and nice here. If
I go in to the city to-morrow
I will try to get a cable
back home to you.

Aunt Mattie, all the home folks.
