My dearest Mother,

I gave the officers an examination and they all did unusually well. Even better than I had expected of them. To-day has been a warm one but it has been lighter than usual with my work. Mother, this <sup>life</sup> cavalry is a wonderful training for a young man and I believe every man should have some of it in his early days.

I want to see all three of us in it soon, that is Joe and Rivers also.

I haven't had much exercise the last few days and I am afraid they will let some one else have my horse while I am away from

Sauge. I don't believe we can get there  
this week.

Mother, ~~did~~<sup>has</sup> the Mississippi College Battery ever  
come <sup>over</sup> here yet? I would like to know. It  
may be that I will run up on some  
of them sometimes. I was in Paris  
for a day about two weeks ago but  
did not have a chance to look Barry R.  
up. I had a number of things to look  
after so did not get to see very much  
of it.

The Colonel of this outfit was in  
to see me to-day and sat in the class  
while I was instructing. But it does  
not matter when you are talking on a  
subject that you know something about.

I still havent received any mail and  
it is over two weeks since I  
left the battery. I havent even heard  
from any of them but guess they  
have been waiting for my address  
which I have sent <sup>now</sup> about ten days  
ago. It doesnt seem like I have been  
away that long but the time is flying  
so probably I will soon get to  
be back with the old Battery and my  
friends.

Love to Dad, Sister and the boys.
