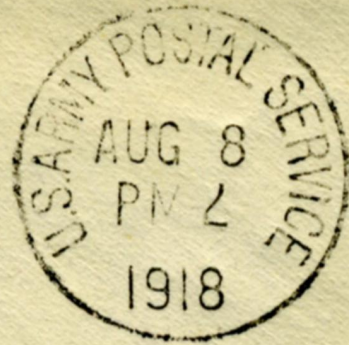

Friday night.

My dear Mother,

This will probably be my last chance to write from this little place as to-morrow I go back to Louge. The outfit goes along also and I suppose I will have them all the time they are there. I would rather have them than to have a new bunch.

My two weeks here have been very pleasant everything

considered. The officers have
been very nice to me in
every way.

Today has been very
changeable for one minute
it has rained and the
next sunshine. More like
last fall when I first
came over.

Mother, while I am in
this kind of work there
will be lots of time

that I will enjoy reading papers
and magazines, So send me
some good ones.

I have had a nice
littl single bed and a good
set of mattresses and springs.
I will have to use my cot
again over at the camp. But
I am used and hardened
to sleeping on anything and
any where. For the last two
days on the front I slept on
the ground on top of my
blankets. It was fine sleeping
because most of the night
I was awake expecting the

attack. Of course, there
was heavy firing near
and I was in command
of the platoon
I had to be on the
alert.

I have just sent
a man over to rent
me a bicycle for a
few minutes so I can
take some exercise. We
have quite a lot of bicycle

riding to do. It is
our only method of
getting around here
where we are all
alone,

The bicycle has come
so I will close and take
a ride. Baskets of love
