Dear Brother

Yours of the 14th Just acknowledging the receipt of Check &c was received in due time, I was truly glad to learn that you expected to leave old N.C. for home so soon, although the few months to come appear longer than the whole time which has elapsed since you left us.

You spoke in your letter of not standing for your Superior Court license, Father remarked when he read what you said about not obtaining them that he would be very sorry to see you without them, that the sum of two dollars was a small consideration with him in connection with your obtaining your license, he therefore requested me to enclose you two dollars for the purpose, which you will please find enclosed, he is very anxious you should stand and obtain your license by all means -

This leaves us all in pretty good health Sister Mary & Amelia are at Holly Springs yet, were up a few days since, are very well pleased with their situation, I heard not a word of your times are pretty brisk, we have received our Spring goods and are selling pretty fast, - we have informed Mrs. Lippincott Hancock of Philad. that we had advised you to call on them and select such books as you may see proper

and have them charged to the care of R. A. A. M. -

you very soon
