Sunday Morning.
Aug. 2th 1918.

My dearest Mother,

I am again back at Camp de Souge. Came here yesterday. The camp has been increased and there are many new faces among the instructors that were not here when I was here about two weeks ago. Yesterday I did not feel so well and the Doctor said he thought I had been slightly poisoned by something I had eaten the day before. This morning I feel all O.K. again.

Capt. Kelley was in Bordeaux yesterday and he saw ^{St. John} Apperson. He was on his way to rejoin the regiment. Just think he has been in Hospital and recuperation camps since the 12th

of March. Capt. K. said that his left hand looked more like a club than it did a hand. If it hadn't been for moving yesterday I would probably have gone into B. and then I would have gotten to Apperson. I would have enjoyed seeing him very much for I thought lots of him as a friend.

Just two days until Sister will be 20 and I can hardly realize it. I wish I could be at home to help her celebrate. Much love and many kisses to her from me. I sent her a birthday letter sometime ago and hope it will arrive on time.

I wish Joe & Rivers would write to me sometimes. I sure will be glad when my mail reaches me.

I believe my last letter from you was
one month ago to-day on the 4th of July.
That night I went up to take a platoon
into position for the big affair that
came a few days later. Yesterday we
received at the hospital here a whole
train loaded with American wounded.
So you can see that ~~our~~ ^{our} troops are in
the fight. Everywhere they are fighting
well.

Mother I will close and go over
to our Sunday dinner, which is very
good but nothing to compare with a
meal at home.
