have had some
more thrills but
we had no losses.

Even under heavy
shelling there are
lots of funny things
that happen. The
last time, I was

we could find
out what it
was. Well, the
shelling lasted
for 15 hours
with out having
a single man
even wounded.

One of the casemates
was completely torn
up but it happened

to be the one
in which we
had no gun.
There is another
Murphy's man in
the regiment who
is a good friend
of mine. Ed. Smith
is his name and
he is also a 1st Lt.
He was a favorite

at the University
of Virginia. I
haven't heard from
Apperson lately. No.
I have never
heard from Perry
Russell and I
do not know his
address.
