My dearest Mother,

I am getting along fine. I had a letter from Ennis two days ago giving the news from the Battery and I find they have been exceedingly lucky to have gone through the fighting they have with very few casualties. He said, I missed lots of good fighting, as he relieved me so he should know. One of my room-mates on the Kronsland Geo. R. Anderson from Ardmore, Okla was



in yesterdays list of killed  
in action. He was a  
fine man and one of  
the most perfect physical  
specimens that I ever saw.

I received a fine letter  
from Rivers and a card  
from Mr. Joe Moore two  
days ago. Was very glad  
to get both of them. Will  
write Rivers soon and  
When you see Mr. Moore



Please tell him how much I  
appreciated the card.

The five Second Liberty Loan  
Bonds I made payable to  
you have been paid up in  
full so you should receive  
them soon. Please let me  
know if you don't receive  
them soon. My pay voucher  
for June was sent to Daddy  
and I have never heard  
whether he has received  
it or not. The Quartermaster  
Corps should have mailed it  
to him from Washington.

Give my love to Sister, Daddy,  
and the Boys.
