Sept. 21st 1918

Saturday morn.

My dearest Mother,

I am all fine
and dandy this
morning. Last night
we were invited
to a minstrel given
by a bunch of the
soldiers here and
it was very much
laughed at by all
who saw it. It was
held in one of the
Y. M. C. A. buildings.
After the minstrel
a Miss Stevenson played
several pieces on

a violin and
we enjoyed her
playing also.

I am still
trying to get my
trunk locker but
as yet I have met
with poor success.
The American Express
Co. is now trying
to find it. I have
not seen it since
February and the
French system of
shipping baggage is
the poorest that I
have ever seen
because you have
to get off the train

at every station to see that your baggage is not put off by mistake.

Yesterday, was a real muddy day so I wore the boots sent me from home and they are fine and a real good fit, so you see I don't expect to wear rubber boots this winter.

I had a letter from Dudley two days ago and he said he found out that

he was about a mile from my battery on the front in July and he went over to see me but I had just left a few days before to come down here, I was sorry to have missed him.

I hope to see Mr. Frierson when he comes over here. Meeting friends from home certainly makes one feel good. Lots of love to all.
