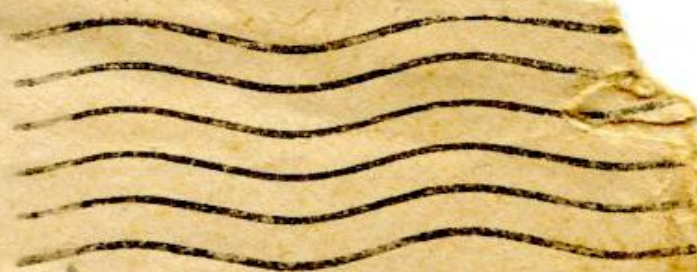

My dearest Mother,

Your fine letter of  
Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> came last evening

said that he goes in train-



ing next week but you  
don't say where or what  
kind of training. I sup-  
pose you have told  
me all about it in  
another letter which  
hain't come yet. I guess  
it is the navy.

I also had a fine  
letter from "Pete" in  
the same mail yesterday.



I understood that my regimental  
commander has been promoted  
and one of the ~~reg~~ majors  
has been killed so I guess  
it will be a new bunch  
when I get back to them  
again. Capt Kelly is going  
back to them this week and  
he promised that he would  
write me as soon as he  
got back and tell me the  
news. I am glad you  
had a letter from old  
John Down. I don't guess  
he will ever forget



the few days that he  
spent with me. Because  
it was at a time when  
we had some shelling  
and many gas alarms.

It was very  
nice that the band  
on returning from  
the patriotic meeting  
at Dublin stopped by



and played "Over There".

I am greatly pleased  
over hearing about  
it.

Mother, I will have  
to close now.
