Camp Fredericksburg Va June 13<sup>th</sup> 1866

Ag Have con Dear Mother

as pa is writing I have concluded to write you a few lines  
we are all well at present & in fine spirits we arrived here only a few days  
ago we thought that we were going to have something to do but I dont  
think we will have any fighting at this place any time soon the Yankees  
are thought to be leaving here our army the greater portion of our troops  
are up towards Culpeper Lee and Stonestreet are maneuvering up that way  
while A P Hill engages them here we can see the old Yankees plain enough  
from our Picket line but have orders not to shoot but I dont guess  
such as this will interest you we had seven men from our Company the  
desert we caught three of them their new names was Paul G. Colwell

of the old  
I James, D. Day that you know

the others are Thomas, J. Cooke C. Brewster

Jacob, A. P. Williams Henry Steel the three first were caught & may be  
shot for all I know but if they are I shall be sorry for them

now I cannot tell when I will get home if ever but I can stay & do any  
as long as the Lord will permit me to bear my health I have been blessed so far

with good health & I thank him for it We I will close trusting that you will  
pray for me I forgot to state that Stephen Baxter Jr. was dead he died at

a few lines I am quite well at present we have been missing about so much  
that I have not learned to write well enough to write a letter yet I am

leaving home before long as soon as some one gets a furlow Pa want let me  
come by myself I expect Pa will resign & come home too this summer
