My dearest Mother,

This has been a rainy Sunday but I have nevertheless enjoyed it. To night it is turning very much colder. I received your letter of Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> last night.

Now that the school

is discontinued if am  
to remain until all  
records and books are  
settled as if am Secty.

I hate to see all my

friends of the last  
few months leaving.

I am Secty, Personnel Officer

and Commander of The

School Detachment so

it was necessary for  
me to stay on here.

Last night I heard  
Margaret Wilson sing,  
and she certainly does  
favor the president.

Her voice is not as  
good as many singers  
you often hear but I  
admire her for singing  
to the soldiers.

To-morrow night is  
the last meeting of all  
the officers and we are

going to have a big  
dinner. To-day five  
of us caught the  
sun shining for  
a few minutes  
so we snapped a  
few pictures. That  
is Capt Howe, Lieut Gurby,  
Harold Simmons and  
my-self. We are

all five Southerners  
but over here we  
are all alike. Sometimes  
we have old civil  
war arguments but  
only for fun.

I would like for  
you to meet my  
present room-mate

from Vermont. He is a  
grand man. After the  
war he will instruct  
French in an American  
University. I think I have  
mentioned his brilliant  
record at Oxford, Eng.
