My dearest Mother.

I am back with the  
regiment and have been  
assigned back to old  
C. Bat. which pleases me  
immensely. Capt. Fred Waters  
is in command as  
Capt. Robbins is now

you to know it. My Captaincy  
was due on Nov. 14<sup>th</sup> but  
on account of the armistice  
of Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> no more promotions  
were given. I had worked  
for it and wanted it  
with all my heart.

But I am having very  
nice times here in Germany  
although there is lots of drilling  
and keeping in fine condition  
for any break. The Germans  
have not suffered nothing like  
what we have heard and

a German home. They  
are especially nice  
to us and try their  
best ~~to~~ to fraternize  
with us for it  
means a lot to them.

They don't believe that  
they are defeated but  
think they made a  
diplomatic mistake in

in about fifty years  
it will all be done  
over again.

I received one letter  
yesterday from Tet  
L. written on Nov. 10  
I was certainly glad  
to get it as it was  
the first in almost  
a month.

I am billeted in

letting the U.S. join with  
the Allies. We are across  
The Rhine on the little River  
Ahr.

Much love to you the  
queen of our home and  
the best Mother in all the  
land. Love to Dad, Sister  
and the boys.
