Dear Lovvadies

About the 10th of May last we enclosed you one hundred and fifty five dollars, from which time we have neither heard from you or the money: so we are getting rather uneasy about it. We have not received a letter from you since some time in April, if you have received the money we have not as yet received any answer from you. So you will heal our uneasiness very much by letting us know whether you have received it or not also why we have received no word from you in so long a time. We cut the money in two and sent you half of each bill in a letter dated 8th the remaining half of which we sent in a letter dated the 10th of April. The most of the money sent was N. & Co. Carolina, We also sent you thirty five dollars by J. P. Redmond who started for Carolina on Sunday last. J. W. Mallory and one of the young mayors are in Carolina now buying negroes. We are all well at this time & have so been pretty well all the Spring

Robert wrote you a few days ago,
I reckon he gave you all the news,
Tamat & vicinity is very healthy except
the Diarrhea which is very prevalent in
the country but not fatal, the Cholera is
very bad in Memphis and Nashville,
I reckon you have heard that Gen. H.
Polk was dead, he died in Nashville
on the 15th ultimo with the Cholera,
Crops are tolerable, futhers is
very good, Corn weather small,
I have nothing new to write
only let us hear from you immediately
