Ringen, Germany

Feb. 19th 1899

My dearest Mother,

I have had a full day
to-day but it passed by very
shortly. Lt. Fred Anderson was
transferred to ~~F~~ Battery A. as
commanding officer. I hated
to see him go as he
was a wonderful fine
man for me to get along
with. He served for over
15 years in a Battery before
coming to E when we started

to the front.

Ralph Kelley, I understand
will be sent to C. Battery.

Kelley has had a hard time
in the regiment because
of his aggressiveness. This
will be his 4 or 5th Battery
that he has served in.

He first went to F, then
C, and B and now E that
I know of besides
serving in Headquarters
company for a while.

Mark has been transferred

to D. battery where he will
be in command for two
weeks while Capt. Bokum
commands the Battalion
and Maj. Robbins is away
I talked to Mank this morn-
ing. I was out with all
the horses for exercise
and he was on his
horse when I passed
through Bölingen so he
rode along with me
for about a ~~mile~~ mile
I love the old battery

very much as it the
only one I have really
served with. But it
was certainly a blow
when Fred Waters died.
I never will forget the
way he talked to me
after I came back to
the regiment. He was
a wonderful leader.
