11. Mar, 1919.

My dearest Mother,

I am O.D. again to-  
day so will write some  
letters. Part of the battery is  
out with the horses having  
horse exercise and the rest  
are having pistol firing  
on the range to-day.

We are getting along fine  
except this life gets on  
our nerves a little at  
odd times.

Gen. Pershing has not  
made his appearance  
yet. I doubt that we  
will ever have to pass  
in review before our  
busy Commander-in-Chief.

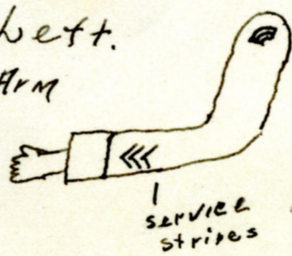
The spring is beginning  
to show and it is  
gone to be beautiful  
here this summer. But  
I am not hoping that  
we stay here to see the  
summer come.

Kelley and I will go  
over and see Mark  
again to-morrow night  
if we can. We had a  
little singing party in the  
officers mess last night.  
Some of the officers have  
real good voices.

I havent had a letter in  
the last five days. Hope  
some will come in to-  
day. Have any more  
boys and men from  
around home been dis-

charged? I am enclosing

ones ~~back home~~ have  
been trying to keep us

wanted to do so.
