My dearest Mother,

I have just returned from Neuenahr where all of the officers of the division met to hear a Col. from G.H.Q. tell about the war. It was rather interesting still it was nothing new to us.

The latest dope is that we should leave here on or about the 9<sup>th</sup> of April and sail from Brest on or about the 15<sup>th</sup>. If that is the case then I should be home by May, 1<sup>st</sup>.

I wrote a bunch of postals this morning. Our schedule now is very nice.

We only work and  
drill from 7 A.M. until  
2<sup>30</sup> P.M. The rest of the  
day we have nothing  
to do. I miss my horse  
now as I have been  
using him quite a bit.  
Yesterday, Kelly and  
I managed to  
get a German horse  
and buggy to take  
us down for a

good bath.

another Lt. Instructor  
that has been away  
from the regiment.

came back yesterday.  
He was away for  
about 8 months. It was  
Lt. Maxwell of B. Battery.

The Rainbow Convention  
will be held in Birmingham,  
Ala. in 1920. I suppose  
there will be reunions  
like those after the civil

war. It has been snow-  
ing hard to-day. Lots of  
it covers the ground  
now.

No further news then  
I will close. Love  
to Dad, Sister and  
the boys.
