Lamarville Aug 28th 1850

Dear Brother Louder I rec^d Yours of
the 19th July in due time & commenced answering
it two or three times but something or other always
happened that I did not get through. It
is late at night and I shall be compelled to
make my epistle short.

Our Family are all enjoy-
ing fine health & have been very healthy all
this season, in fact there has been but my
little sickness in the neighbour hood this
year for which we ought to be very thankful,

Bro. Allison left Lamar on
the 31st day of July for the East to buy goods
we rec^d a letter from him yesterday stating that
he was well and would be back about
the 1st of September. The crop of Little Oats are
small. Crop are tolerable in this neighbourhood
The Farmers did not think they would make
a 1/2 crop at one time but I believe they have
got out of that notion & think they will
make at least 3/4 of a crop. Fathers
crop is about as good as any I know
of.

I will close for the present, as I
expected you was a little anxious to hear, may
drop you thus line to let you know that we
are well &c I will give you a more full
detail of things in a few days more &
let us know how your health is &c.

Give my best respects to Mary &
tell him to write to me according to
promises &c. the last I heard, his fathers family
were well.
