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Explanatory Statement

The Midyear College Accounting Testing Program was undertaken in 1951 with the primary purpose of providing for the testing of seniors graduating at the end of the first semester and June graduates who need to obtain results of tests for use in employment interviews early in the spring.

During the four years that this program has been carried on, emphasis has gradually been shifted by the participating colleges themselves from the testing of seniors to the testing of students in lower classes, although the Level II Achievement Test continues to be administered to a considerable number of seniors. In the current program, by far the largest number of students taking part in the midyear program were first-year students.

The number of participating colleges and the number of tests administered during the midyear program in each of the four years are as follows:

It will be observed that the 1954 midyear program was considerably larger than the one in 1953 although somewhat smaller than the programs held in 1951 and 1952.

The total of 1,932 tests administered in this year's program was accounted for by the following numbers of the different kinds of tests: Orientation Test, 981; Achievement Test, Level I, 640; Achievement Test, Level II, 301; Strong blank, 10.

Of the total number of tests used during the midyear program, 1,563 were forms recommended for this program and 359 were out-of-program forms. The distributions of the results of the regular program tests are shown in Tables I through IV. The medians of the combined distributions of scores from the first three midyear programs are shown in the tables for purposes of comparison.

The medians made on the Orientation Test by the first-year group in the 1954 program are, as shown in Table I, slightly above the earlier medians. For the small group of seniors taking the Orientation Test, this year's medians are a few points low as compared with those for the three preceding years.

The median of the scores of the first-year students on Achievement Test, Level I, is several points below the median resulting from the three earlier programs. The median for the seniors on the Level II Achievement Test is very close to the earlier one.

Second- and third-year students in five participating colleges took the Level II test even though it is not designed for use below the senior year. The results are, on the average, considerably lower than those for the seniors, although there is much overlapping in the distributions of scores.
