Gov. Ross Barnett went out to Jackson's largest manufacturing plant Storkline Corporation, yesterday to discuss woodwork and its connection with Missis-

sippi's economy.

With less accent on fanfare, however, the governor then launched into hard-down facts and figures to cite that total industrial payrolls in Mississippi are ten times as large as in 1940. Per capita income was \$218 a year where today it is \$1173.

There are 120,000 people working in manufacturing industries in this state now.

The largest employer is the apparel industry with 29,000 workers.

Woodwork is next with more than 18,000 workers. Food and kindred products employ 16,000.
