Dr. George B. Engberg of the Department of History at the University of Cincinnati has recently completed the writing of a history of labor in the Lake States lumber industry. The title of the work is, "Men for the Pineries - Lumber Workers in the Lake States, 1830 - 1930."

This work was originally done as a PhD dissertation by Dr. Ingberg at the University of Minnesota. He has been working during the last year revising the manuscript in the hope of finding a publisher.
